




School Holiday Literacy Learning


All parents are urged to download this handbook and discuss the safety content with your children.

The Hope of a New Beginning! Gospel in Life

Do you remember your first day of school? For some people new beginnings represent opportunities and are full of adventure. For others, change is difficult and is associated with fear and anxiety. Some changes are chosen. For example, a new school, a new job, a move of house. Others are forced upon one by circumstances: redundancy, death, becoming a refugee, seeking asylum from those who seek to punish and kill. Not even the Church is free from change today. Many dioceses are discussing the changes of Mass times, perhaps the clustering or amalgamation of parishes, maybe even celebrating Sunday with a liturgy in the absence of a priest. What seemed impossible in the past is now being discussed. The old certainties are disappearing. Whilst some may see opportunities in the new situation, others are fearful and seek security.

Change is always difficult, even when it is chosen. Forced change is painful and shatters life. It may take a long time to recover. Refugees and asylum seekers, the victims of warfare and conflict, did not choose their situation. It happened, and now they must carry the pain of it. Women or men who have been made redundant know the pain of forced change, which has dramatically altered their lives, relationships and financial situations. Life is often unpredictable and we long for some stability and order in the midst of confusion. In a situation of change it can be difficult to remain hopeful, and God can seem very distant and uncaring. People ask, 'Why is God silent?' or 'Why did this happen to me?'

To trust God's providence requires great faith. The disciples who knew Jesus in the flesh struggled to believe in him. Many people pray, 'Lord, I believe: help my unbelief'. One should not lose heart if doubt persists. It can be a period for deepening faith. The path to becoming a friend of God needs time; different people are at different stages of the journey. God is gentle and does not rush persons but allows each to respond in her or his own time. God works in God's own time in ways that are deeply mysterious.
