The community took bated breaths as the weather cleared and the fete went off with a BANG!

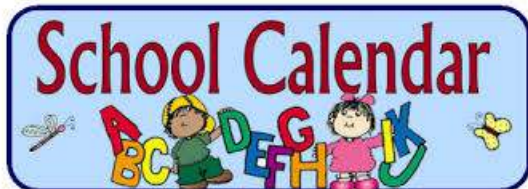
What an amazing fete! The fete serves two very distinct purposes,

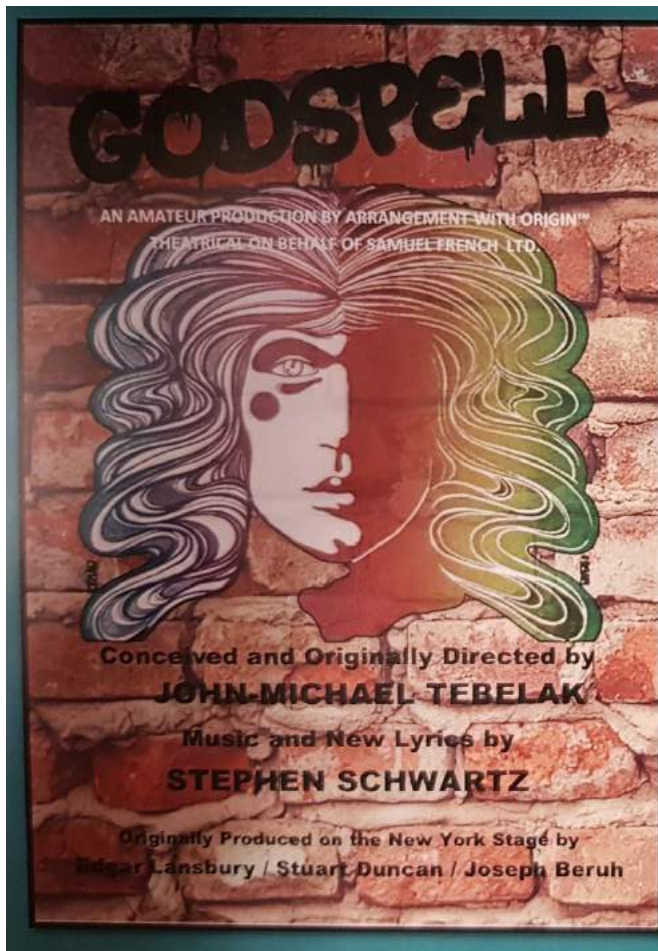

# 2018 Diocesan School Fees

24 October 2017

Dear parents and carers

Please find below the 2018 Diocesan school fees schedule which includes a modest 3.6% increase on the fees from 2017.

School-based fees will also be limited to a 3.6% increase to ensure we have consistency across our Diocese. School-based fees cover the costs of important things such as technology and school administration.

I appreciate that from time to time, some families might experience financial challenges. With this in mind, I take this opportunity to remind you that confidential fee support is available through

- discounts for families with multiple siblings in our schools
- flexible payment plans
- hardship concession policies for families in need
- the Bishop Manning Scholarship Fund
- the Byawalla Co-contribution Scheme for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families

## Diocesan Building Levy - 2018

The Diocesan Building Levy enables us, through our capital works program, to meet the demand for new schools and new classes in high growth areas, and to continue to maintain all schools to a high standard.

All families with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College Kingswood are required to pay the annual Diocese of Parramatta Diocesan Building Levy. This levy has replaced the various building levies that parents previously paid to school building funds (managed by either parishes or schools). **The levy for 2018 is \$783 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$261 in Terms 1, 2 and 3.**

## Annual Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents - 2018

The Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents for 2018 is **\$1,935 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$645**. The fee applies to new students on the following visa numbers: 173, 401, 402, 411, 415, 416, 417, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 456, 457, 459, 462, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 884, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090.

Families charged this fee in 2013 will continue to be charged on a *per family* basis to the eldest student whilst the family has continuous current students.

Thank you for your continuing support of Catholic education, support that allows us to provide students with exciting learning experiences within our Catholic faith environment.

# KISS AND DROP



Kiss and Drop is a service provided to the parents of St Bernadette's and is run by the community group. Kiss and Drop is available mornings 8.30am-9.00am and afternoons from 3.15pm-3.30pm. Parent volunteers give up their time to assist your children safely in and out of the car. If you are not the sole person responsible for picking up your child could you please pass this information onto others that may drop off or pick up your child. Below are few helpful hints to ensure Kiss and Drop remains a service free of accidents.

You may notice there are some new points in our guidelines. We have been in discussion with the police department due to their increasing presence in our area and they have advised us of some legalities with our service.

## GARDENIA GROVE HELPFUL HINTS

- \* Please remember to be kind and courteous to the volunteers. They are giving up their time to help you.
- \* Always remember to NEVER cross the road through the morning or afternoon cars that are in the queue waiting to drop off or pick up their children. Please either walk your children all the way around the cul-de-sac or up to the top of Gardenia Grove.
- \* Always remember to NEVER call your children to cross the road if you have parked on the opposite side of the Kiss and Drop zone.
- \* Please allow enough time for delays in Kiss and Drop. If you are running late please be patient while waiting in the queue.
- \* Resident's driveways along Gardenia Grove should not be used for parking.
- \* Do not park in NO PARKING zones along Gardenia Grove.
- \* Drive SLOWLY along Gardenia Grove, children can be unpredictable.
- \* For safety reason, please DO NOT complete a three point turn in our neighbour's driveways as this is very unsafe with many child and cars in the area. Please drive to the end of the cul-de-sac and turn around safely.



## AM HELPFUL HINTS

- \* Ensure your child is ready to leave the car when you have approached the drop off zone. If your child is not ready please drive past slowly and rejoin the queue as this delays others in the queue.
- \* Remember that your child should only get out of the car when you have reached the FRONT of the queue and not while you are waiting in line.

## PM HELPFUL HINTS

- \* Always remember to not line up prior to 3.15pm, police are out and about and will fine anyone found to be parking early in Gardenia Grove.
- \* **NO child 7 years or under** will be placed in the front seat by our parent volunteers. The law states that children 7 years or younger must be in the rear seats (if there is room) and in a child restraint or booster seat.
- \* NO child will be walked around to the drivers' side of the car by volunteers as this is very unsafe for both children and volunteers.
- \* When queuing in the line please do not block traffic in Wheeler Street, particularly near the pedestrian crossing as this is a very unsafe practice and illegal. Waiting in the bus zone is also illegal so if the line is at the top of Gardenia Grove you just drive past and try to rejoin the queue when there is room for your car in Gardenia Grove.
- \* Please ensure your "name sign" is displayed on the dashboard of your car to assist the volunteers and teachers who are organising the children. Your car will be waved on if there is no sign. Signs are available from the school office.
- \* Remain in the queue until you have reached the pick up zone. Gardenia Grove is a very busy street and does not handle the Kiss and Drop queue and traffic coming both ways beside the queue.
- \* Please ensure your child is safely in the car before taking off.

Please remember to have any family member that may also use this service read these guidelines.

The question as to whether or not it is lawful to pay taxes to Caesar was a serious one, and it really put Jesus in a spot. If he said it was lawful, he would be regarded as a traitor to the Jewish cause and the Jewish religion. If he said it was unlawful, he could be denounced as fomenting rebellion against Rome. In his answer Jesus implied that there need not be conflict between the demands of the State and those of God. The State has its role, but its power is limited and does not supplant God. From this principle Christians deduced that they could accommodate loyalty to the State. Today you can find people who enjoy dual citizenship – they are citizens of two countries. Every Christian has dual citizenship.

Christians are citizens of the country in which they happen to be living or in which they were born. To it they owe many benefits. To its forces of law and order they owe the fact that they are able to live in peace and security. To its public services they owe transport, water, light, etc. They also owe their education, medical and health care, unemployment benefits, and so on, to it.

These benefits mean they are under obligation to the State. The legitimate State has rights, and Christians will respect those rights. They must respect its laws and rulers. They must be responsible citizens, and, as far as they are able, must play their part in making the country a good place for all its citizens. Failure to be a good citizen is a failure in Christian duty. To cheat the State is to cheat one's fellow citizens, and to cheat one's fellow citizens is to cheat God. But Christians are also citizens of the Kingdom of God. To it they owe certain other privileges, and to it they also have obligations. In many cases the two responsibilities do not clash. But at times they may. And when they do, Christians will spontaneously know which one comes first.

However, it may not always be that simple. What Jesus gave us was only a principle. He didn't give us a detailed theory of political obligations or a blueprint for Church-State relations. Christians would have to work out the implications of it. In practice it is not always easy to say this is for Caesar and that for God. Life is a unity. It can't be split into two clearly defined parts – the secular part and the religious part. However, history shows unequivocally that separation of Church and State is absolutely essential. But when Jesus said, 'Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar' his assumption was that Caesar's claim would be just. He wasn't giving Caesar a blank cheque.

Christians can sometimes be faced with a real dilemma – how to be a Christian in a secular world where the laws may often be unchristian. However, true Christians will strive to be good citizens of their country, and at the same time good citizens of the Kingdom of God. They will fail neither in their duty to God nor to their fellow sisters and brothers. But as Christians our first and deepest loyalty is to God. To God alone we render worship, but in other things we gladly acknowledge and serve the secular powers, praying that they will rule wisely and justly.

Weekly Parable from E-News

### NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

During November we will pray for our deceased relatives and friends. 'From the beginning, the Church has honoured the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic Sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beautiful vision of God.' (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1032)

**November Mass Envelopes** are available in the basket at the back of the Church for your use. **All Masses during November** will be offered in union with the living and the dead. November gives us the opportunity to stop and reflect on the communion between the living and the dead. All Mass Intention Envelopes will be placed in a Special Remembrance Box and placed in front of the Altar for ALL November Masses.

**On All Souls Day Thursday 2nd November** we commemorate the souls of all the faithful departed. We are very aware of those we miss, and we pray for them. We are aware of the love of God permeating all existence and connecting us even in death. We are reminded of the source of our hope, the risen Christ. As we reflect on the gift of eternal life, the significance of our earthly choices comes into clear view.
