The students were engaged in a range of specific activities designed to assess their readiness for school. They demonstrated a genuine interest and curiosity in all tasks and eagerness to be at 'big school'. Parents were assembled in the hall and took part in a program that aimed to ensure they are prepared for the leap into, 'big school'. Over the two days the parents heard many specialist including a speech therapist, behavioural optometrist, school counselor and literacy and numeracy experts.

A crucial element of transition is building positive relationships between school and home. Positive relationships help to reduce parental and student anxiety making the transition to school just that little bit easier. We look forward to officially welcoming our new families in 2018.

Writing Stimulus Week 3

Last Week St Bernadette's Students welcomed a special visitor to the school. Hendrix my beautiful Spoodle dog spent the day with us. Each class enjoyed a visit with Hendrix, playing with him, cuddling, watching him do some of his tricks and discussing the pros and cons of pet ownership, in particular owning a dog.

As part of this experience the students worked with their teachers to discuss. plan and write a letter to Mr K in response to the question Should we have a School Pet?

The students have spent a great deal of time forming arguments for and against, exploring language structures, persuasive language and features of Persuasive Text. As a result, they have each independently written their own letter, which the teachers will compare to their Term 2 writing to inform student's progression in writing and to form learning goals for each student.

I must say the level of writing produced across the school is guite impressive and Mr K has quite a task on his hands to decide the outcome of these arguments.



In 1976 Muhammad Yunus was a young economics professor at Chittagong University in Bangladesh. Realising that the people in the nearby village of Jobra were struggling to recover from poverty in the aftermath of the terrible 1974 famine, Yunus made a group of 42 women a small loan of \$27.

Up until then, their only course of action had been to borrow money from loan sharks so they could buy bamboo to make furniture, and hope to claw their way out of destitution. Of course only a lucky few made it that way.

Yunus' loan was the first transaction of what would become the Grameen Bank, or 'Bank of the Villages'. Today, the bank still specialises in microcredit—providing affordable loans of very modest sums to some of the world's poorest people—and it is estimated that over half of Grameen's 50 million Bangladeshi borrowers have risen out of the acute poverty thanks to their loans.

In 2006 Yunus and the bank were jointly awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, 'for their efforts to create economic and social development from below'.

It is clear that there are commandments within commandments; that is if we follow the spirit of the two great commandments, the smaller ones will take care of themselves. For who, with love in their heart, could mistreat an orphan or a woman who had lost her husband?

So, you might ask, if we have these overarching commandments, what's the point of the detail? Well, as the saying goes: 'When you are up to your neck in alligators, it is difficult to remind yourself your initial objective was to drain the swamp!'

Day-to-day reality means it's easy to lose the bigger picture, and at times we need specific guidance to help us deal with the interferences and negotiate the obstacles that life puts in our way. The details can function as stepping stones so that we can haul ourselves up onto them and gradually work our way back out of the swamp to see the bigger picture again.

Muhammad Yunus was able to help the women of Jobra most effectively by taking the smallest steps, enabling them to work up to bigger things. Indeed, the Grameen Bank now has over two thousand branches in Bangladesh and continues to expand.

We could perhaps distil Jesus' two great commandments even further into the single word 'love'. As the Beatles sang, 'it's all you need'. But the problem is that it becomes something so rarefied, such a large concept, that it's overwhelming, impossible to apply to everyday life.

If, on the other hand, we start with small steps, by treating each other with basic fairness and respect, we will get glimpses of the love that Jesus tells us about. Weekly Parable from E-News
