### Principal's Message

This week students in Year 3 and 5 completed the NAPLAN Assessments. Students completed four assessments;

- 1. Language Conventions Assessment
- 2. Writing Assessment
- 3. Reading Assessment
- 4. Numeracy Assessment

NAPLAN is a standardised assessment that is completed by students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9. Standardised assessments allow schools to get an accurate picture of how a student's learning is progressing and identify any areas of need.

At St Bernadette's we use the data to;

- 1. Analyse individual student learning progress
- 2. Identify individual student needs
- 3. Identify learning trends across the school.

The data informs our school improvement plan. Our current Literacy and Numeracy goals reflect some areas of need that the 2017 NAPLAN and other assessment measures identified as requiring a school wide focus.

Community opinion about NAPLAN are wide and varied. I always try to keep things in perspective

for our community and have consistently stated that NAPLAN is a series of assessments conduct at one point of time in a students learning year. The results are used to inform learning but should not be viewed from a deficit model. This means the data identifies learning and teaching opportunities.

Term 2 also marks a fast approach to the midpoint in the year. This means that reports and Parent Interviews are vast approaching. Reports provide an opportunity for all stakeholders, students, parents and teachers to reflect on the year's progress and determine what needs to be done to ensure individual students achieve their full potential. If you have questions about your child's learning or progress these should not be left until Parent Interview time as half the year will already be gone. Questions should be directed to staff as required so you have an informed picture of your child's learning progress.

I would like to thank all the parents who have returned their pledged money for the Commonwealth Games Athon. This was a significant fundraiser organised by the Parent Group. We are fortunate at St Bernadette's to have an active Parent Group that organises such events. The funds raised are always used to support the learning of all students. Any outstanding pledge money can still be returned the school. On behalf of the school community I thank the members of the community who assisted to plan and run the Commonwealth GamesAthon. It was a fun filled day for all of the students!

The cold weather has arrived! A reminder to all families that full winter uniform is now an expectation. Students should be wearing school jumpers and jackets, other jackets are not permitted without prior discussion with a staff member. Thank you to all parents who ensure their children wear white shoes for sport. This is now a school wide expectation. I appreciate that this may cause some challenges for some families but ask that you work with the school to meet this expectation in a timely manner.

In the coming week I will begin to contact parents whose child / children have developed attendance concerns. At St Bernadette's we expect school attendance to be maximised. Our goal is 90% attendance. This means students should not have more than 5 days off school a term. This may not sound like a lot of days off, but it converts to one week of learning lost a term and 4 weeks learning lost over a year. If a child has 4 weeks off a year over their schooling life they would have missed 52 weeks of school! That's more than one year of missed learning. Consider the impact this could have on a child's education and future!

A Parent Survey will be sent home to collect your thoughts and ideas about what is currently working in our school award structure and what can be changed and how. I invite all parents to respond so that opinions are captured. Whilst I can't guarantee all ideas will be implemented, I will guarantee that all returned surveys will be read and considered. 
#### Makerspace

### Road Safety

To continue to support safety here at St Bernadette's we're encouraging our students and parents/carers to ensure they use the pedestrian crossings where available when walking to or from school. 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#### The new childcare subsidy, and what it means for you

On the 2nd of July, the Australian Government will transition to a new Child Care Subsidy (CCS). This will replace the existing Childcare Rebate (CCR) and Childcare Benefit (CCB).

There are a number of key changes that families who rely on childcare before and/or after school need to know, including:

- Any benefit will be paid be paid directly to child care providers (like Camp Australia), who will then only bill the 'gap' amount to families.
- There will continue to be hardship relief.
- For families earning less than \$186,958, there will no longer be an annual cap on the amount of subsidy you can
  receive. For families earning between \$186,958 and \$351,248, an increased annual subsidy cap of \$10,000 per child
  will apply each year.

"Time to go". We all know what that means. If you come from a family like mine, it means we're entering into a period of goodbyes that make us loiter in the doorway for another half hour.

Sooner or later, though, we're going to finish that final conversation, give that last hug, say that last I-love-you, and wish the travellers a safe journey home. And then they're gone.

For a moment, there's an almost visible space in the room shaped just like Aunt Elsie and the kids. That same shaped emptiness is curiously echoed in the heart.

Even the silence sounds curiously like the folks who have just left. The disciples standing around after the Ascension must have experienced something like that.

A Jesus-shaped space where he stood, a Jesus-sounding silence where he'd spoken. There was a space in their hearts, too, that would always long for him to fill it.

And yet the same must have been true of them as it is for us when we take leave of our loved ones. Their presence remains brilliantly in their absence.

They're not here but are hardly gone for good.

You can't kill love off that easily. Love never leaves the room.

How do you keep Jesus close even when he may seem absent?
