Principal's Message

St Bernadette's Band - A New Offering!

Last Tuesday night Mrs Huntington and myself held a community meeting to discuss the future direction of the St Bernadette's Band. The Band has been a part of the school for at least 25 years. It was established by parents to provide an opportunity for students to experience and access musical instruments and lessons provided by musicians. This is a good opportunity to thank our current parent Band Committee as well as previous band committees for the legacy they have built.

This year it has become apparent that the St Bernadette's Band can no longer operate as a separate entity administered by the Parent Group. Governance regulations that apply to all education settings mean that the band's operation must be incorporated into the overall school's operations. This was identified late in Term 1 of this year and I was given until the beginning of Term 3 to either absorb the band as a formal element of the school or no longer have a band. This was a short time frame and has been extremely challenging to meet given it was not on the school's agenda for 2018 to coordinate and resource. took this as an opportunity to strengthen the Creative Arts offering at St Bernadette's. I believe the continued operation of the band is a must and we need to do all we can to ensure this great tradition not only remains, but is strengthened to be a long term offering at the school. As such I approached Captivate, the Creative Arts wing of Catholic Education Parramatta. Mark, David and Françoise expressed an immediate desire to assist us to maintain and strengthen our 2018 band offering and expand it into 2019.

Information about Captivate can be found at, <u>http://captivate.parra.catholic.edu.au/</u> For the remainder of 2018 the band will continue to operate as normal. The exceptions are;

- All band fees will be payable to the school. The school will take over the financial administration of the band effective Term 3. We are working through how this will look, but be assured that payments will remain the same.
- Captivate staff will begin to assess how the current band offering can be improved. They will begin by implementing observations of tutors and lessons to assess effectiveness and possible changes to organisation.
- We want to increase the amount of students accessing this opportunity.
- School staff will begin to work with the tutors and parents to understand the bands operations and how to improve these moving forward.
- A school committee has been formed including Mrs Huntington and Ms Barrak who will assist school leadership.
- The Band Committee will continue to assist in Band operations in particular the day to day operations as we learn from each other.
- As we move forward into 2019 we will be discussing how the music offering can be expanded. This may include;
- Whole class access to instrument lessons in primary grades
- Ongoing provision of tutorial lessons
- Implementation of a K-6 music program

This is only possible with the ongoing support of our parents, the Captivate team and school staff. I have said from the outset that I have very little knowledge of musical teaching, but I do want to learn as we build a better opportunity for our students.

School Uniform

There are a number of students consistently wearing incorrect uniform in particular jackets. This is an unacceptable situation that needs to be addressed by parents. I will not ask students to remove jackets, but share other parents frustration at this apparent lack of respect for school uniform. If you are experiencing any challenges in regards to uniforms please approach the school for assistance.

Before School Expectations

There is no supervision for any students who arrive to school prior to 8.30. Parents are advised that students should not be at school prior to 8.30 as their safety can not be assured. Students are having verbal disagreements before school which is then being reflected in their own going behaviour throughout the day.

During the morning games are restricted to handball only. Basketballs, footballs, etc are not allowed. This is for the safety of all students. Stage 2 and 3 have predetermined handball areas. Parents should talk to their children to ensure they understand these expectations.

Science Week at St Bernadette's

Last week St Bernadette's celebrated Science Week.

The week started with a Science show by 'Scienza Viva'. Chris Howe lead the students through a number of interactive demonstrations of science. They had the opportunity to look at large stick insects, test a weight propelled wheel and play with a tornado in a bottle. They watched how to make 'elephant's toothpaste' by combining yeast, detergent and hydrogen peroxide and were shown how air moves by using hair dryers to launch ping pong balls.

Early Stage One have been learning about materials that various objects are made of. During Science week, the parents were invited to visit the ES1 classroom while the students designed and made waterproof sculptures. They then left their sculptures in the school garden overnight and checked them the next day to see if they were successful.

At the beginning of the term, the Stage 1, 2 and 3 students were invited to make a 3D science model.

Seventy students chose to do this project, and on Wednesday they presented their work to students, teachers and parents. It was evident that each and every child put a lot of thought and effort into their projects and they showed such enthusiasm when they were presenting what they had learned. The science teachers would like to thank these students for their fantastic work.

We would also like to thank the parents who helped their children with their projects. We hope you enjoyed the experience as much as they did.





I arrived in Phnom Penh after a 15-hour flight. It was a relief to know that friends were waiting and in a few minutes I would pass through Customs and be taken to my accommodation. I joined a queue of tired travellers watching suitcases and backpacks slowly appear on the luggage carousel, hoping like everyone else that mine would be among the first. No such luck. There were sighs of relief as each passenger spotted their luggage. Soon I was the only person remaining. Unclaimed luggage kept circling but my poor old backpack was nowhere to be seen. Just then an airport official tapped me on the shoulder and announced in broken English that there was no more luggage. Anxiety set in as I realised that I was in Cambodia with nothing more than the clothes I stood in, a book, toothpaste and a toothbrush. The official directed me to the counter for lost and unclaimed baggage. One hour and many forms later I was informed that my luggage would be found and would arrive on the next flight, due in eight hours. I wanted to believe him, but doubt was all I could feel. My mind raced ahead wondering how I was going to manage and where I could buy clothes. Luckily my friends were still waiting as I made my belated appearance. I told them of my ordeal and much to my surprise they reacted as though this was an everyday occurrence. Unlike me they had little doubt the backpack would appear later in the day. And so it did. Things do work out if only we believe and trust. (Mick)
