Principal's Message

Welcome to the beginning of Term 3 and the second semester of learning in 2018. It's hard to believe that half the year has passed by. For adults we look back and many of us can't quite fathom where the time has gone and wonder, what have we done? For students Term 3 is where students really start to show their learning abilities.

Last semester our Teacher Educators (TE's) for literacy and numeracy worked with school leadership to build the teaching capacity of our class teachers. Our Kindergarten and Stage 1 teachers were supported by our literacy TE, while our Stage 2 and Stage 3 teachers were supported by our numeracy TE. All stages were supported by school leadership to support both literacy and numeracy teaching and learning. Additionally, a Project Based Learning (PBL) TE assisted Stage 2, Stage 3 and our Science Team to develop effective projects. All teachers received one on one professional learning to build Religious Education teaching. Our staff were well supported to improve their teaching and thus the learning of all students.

Moving into Semester Two we have adjusted our learning focus to meet new needs. Our literacy TE will begin to work with our Stage 2 and 3 teachers whilst our numeracy TE will focus on Stage 1 and Stage 3. Focus stages were identified by school leadership, CEDP leadership and our class teaching teams. Additionally our project design support for PBL has been maintained and all staff will receive personalized professional learning opportunities for Religious Education.

As you can see the staff are in the midst of a large learning agenda to improve and refine teaching for all students.

The School Locker

At the end of Term 2 we met with, The School Locker to discuss some uniform concerns. We are aware of some ongoing issues with purchasing uniforms and are working with staff from The School Locker to improve supply. We have signed off on new suppliers to ensure the current issues do not occur again. We are also working to ensure consistent fabric colours are utilised for all uniform items and that approved school logos are used appropriately on garments. This will see consistency of uniforms improved.

<u>Library Update</u>

Our new library is slowly coming together. We have taken delivery of approximately 80% of the ordered furniture, but are missing vital elements due to damage in shipping. This is obviously disappointing for all as our vision was to open our new library at the beginning of this term. We are working with our suppliers to resolve this issue as quickly as possible.

<u>School Maintenance</u>

Late last term all trees were inspected by an arborist. This is a regular element of our school maintenance cycle. The Education Act states that schools must act on advice provided by a qualified arborist. Therefore, during the holidays a tree as well as the stumps in the adventure playground were removed and all trees were dead wooded. This has left some damage to the softfall in the adventure playground that will be repaired soon. This maintenance ensures the safety of all students. We have recently received a grant from CEDP to replace all of the broken concrete in the top playground with new concrete. This is an expense that would be challenging for us to complete without system support. We are currently in the process of working out scheduling to have this work done, but some inconvenience may be caused to school and parish operations whilst this work is completed.

<u> School Band Update</u>

This term the school officially took control of the School Band. I would like to thank the current committee members, Ms Brandwood and Mrs Nash for their ongoing support and commitment to ensure the band continues to operate. We are still working through many elements of running a school band and ask for your patience as we learn in weeks what the Band Committee has done for over 25 years. Some of the issues include;

- 1. We are in the process of working with CEDP to determine how to invoice individual families. The ongoing financing of the band is new to our school and will require some back office support and setup.
- 2. We have begun conducting a full audit of instruments held by the band to determine which student has individual instruments and where any outstanding instruments are. All outstanding instruments should be returned if students are no longer active participants of the band. All instruments will be asserted as property of St Bernadette's
- Meeting with the current tutors to understand what they do and any challenges they are experiencing.
- 4. Establish a school team to administer the school band.
- 5. Determine what processes are required to administer the band efficiently.

Good luck to all students participating in the Premier's Reading Challenge. The Premier's Reading Challenge closes on Friday 31st August.




<u>Overdue Library Books</u>

Save the Date!!!





AND JESUS SAID, "CHILL OUT!" Gospel in Life!

Over pizza after prayer, the young people would often tell me how much the meditation helped relieve the stress caused by school, sports, friends and family. I was happy they escaped for an hour with us.

And that's what Jesus wants for his disciples in this week's Gospel. They've just come back from doing his work. They could keep working; there were plenty of people who needed help. But Jesus says, "Come away and rest". In other words, take time to chill out. Authentic discipleship requires downtime for prayer, laughs, naps and talk about life.

Our society seems to get busier and busier. We seem to have more responsibilities and less time to relax. But life gets more complicated, more painful, less rewarding and less Christian when it gets too busy.

Overworked people pray less, which means they lose God's guidance. Overworked people lose their patience more quickly, which makes it easy to snap at friends or family and difficult to forgive. Overworked people think less thoroughly and listen less often, which makes it easy to make bad decisions.

So, make sure you get away. Life is about building relationships, not completing tasks. Given the pressure in our society to stay busy, you might even have to schedule downtime. Then take it. God wants it for you.

Take time with friends. Laugh. Hang out. Take naps. Build in ten-minutes "rest stops" with God, when you just close your eyes and imagine Jesus wrapping his arms around you. You'll find life more rewarding and Christian living more doable. In other word, just chill out.

Is your life too hectic? Identify one thing you could do to build in more downtime?
