From The Principal

<u>NAPLAN</u>

Last week all students in Years 3 and 5 received their NAPLAN results. Schools are yet to have access to the digital program, SCOUT which allows us to analyse results and see how individual students have done. This access is provided by NSW Government and should be available soon. All schools despite the system they belong to are in the same situation. NAPLAN is an indication of a students progress at a period of time. It is one test on one day and does not define a student. All students learning has progressed since NAPLAN was sat at the beginning of Term 2. If you have any concerns you are encouraged to discuss these with your child's class teacher. But remember staff have limited access to results at this time so may take time to respond to your concerns.

Before School Supervision

We have growing concerns for the safety of students arriving at school before 8.30, the time for designated student arrival and supervision. Students have been arriving as early as 7.15am in the morning, over an hour before the designated student arrival and supervision time.

Staff and parents have increasingly stressed their concerns for student safety. This has prompted an investigation into our responsibilities as a school. Teachers are required to supervise students 30 minutes prior to the school start time. This is a part of the Teachers Enterprise Agreement and is a work

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condition. Therefore, any change to supervision times that affects the whole staff body is not an option. The school has a duty of care for all students on the property and must have processes to ensure students are not present outside of regulated supervision times. Safety considerations for students and staff are of high importance and procedures need to be in place that minimise risk to safety. Therefore the following changes will take place from the beginning of Term 4;

- 1. Access to the school will not be available to students prior to the designated 8.30 supervision time. Gates will remain locked until this time with no access to parents or students.
- 2. Students enrolled in and attending before and after school care in Oosh, which shares part of the school premises, have separate arrival and supervision arrangements with that facility. They will not be affected.
- 3. Special provisions for School Band members who require access at 8am on Tuesday mornings will be made.

Students not enrolled in before and after school care are considered to be in the care of parents or carers before 8:30am. The school commences supervision and care for students and permits student arrival on school premises from 8:30am each school day. As you know, the safety and wellbeing of students is our priority. If you would like to discuss these arrangements, please contact me. School First Aid officers do not start work before 8:30am each morning. This means should an injury occur there are no suitably qualified staff to attend to injured students.

<u>Band Students</u>

Could all students who have a school instrument for band bring it to school on Tuesday the 16th of October, Week 1 of Term 4 for tagging. A member of the Captivate Team will be present on Wednesday to tag all items to assist with tracking of instruments.

<u>Captivate 2019</u>

As you would be aware we have been working with Captivate to re-imagine how music is offered at St Bernadette's in 2019 and into the future. We have agreed on a new model that will see all students in Year 4 and 5 learn how to play a musical instrument during regular school time. Captivate will provide a specialist music teacher to collaboratively work with staff during this time. This is an exciting evolution that will provide an opportunity for all students who attend St Bernadette's as they move into Year 4 and 5 to learn a skill that they might otherwise never experience. The school has committed to purchase additional instruments to enable this activity to run in 2019 and has a plan to ensure we build our instrument stock as required. Families with students in year 4 and 5 will see an additional fee for 2019 to enable maintenance, cleaning and hire of instruments. The current band offering of small group tutorials will be maintained for students in Years 3 and 6. We have not worked the details out for this yet, but plan to continue this offering into 2019 and beyond. Captivate have also committed to work with school staff in all grades to improve their current creative arts offerings. This will be an evolving process throughout 2019.

Second Hand Uniforms

Second hand uniforms will no longer be for sale through The School Locker uniform shop. We recognise that the option of purchasing second hand uniforms is important to our community. As such we will continue to collect and sell second uniforms. Unwanted uniforms that are in good condition can be dropped off at the office. At advertised periods throughout the year second uniforms will be made available for sale. We anticipate that this will occur at times when the community gathers for special events.

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<u>School Uniforms</u>

We appreciate that throughout winter purchasing some items from The School Locker have been challenging. We have been working with staff from the School Locker to ensure that such disruptions are minimised in the future. We are currently working to secure a more consistent supply chain. This will address supply issues and problems with consistency regarding school logos, uniform colours and designs. As we move into Term 4, and summer uniform, we hope that all students will be wearing full summer uniform. **A reminder to all parents that students are expected to wear predominately white shoes on sport days**. By Term 4 I would expect most students to be following this expectation.

<u>Student Attendance</u>

I want to thank all those parents and students who consistently strive to ensure school attendance is maximised. Many students have been affected by sickness throughout the winter months. This is unavoidable and I want to reassure parents that no one wants students at school who are sick. As we move into the warmer months we look forward to reduced illness and maximum student attendance. Thank you all for diligence in this area and particularly to those who have had challenges throughout the winter months.

<u>Maintenance</u>

In the school holidays the top playground will undergo major maintenance. The existing concrete will all be removed and replaced. This may cause some disruption to parking for parishioners attending Mass, but should be finished prior to school commencing in Term 4.

<u> Teacher Learning Hub</u>

With the completion of the Library, Multipurpose Room 2 has been refitted into a Teacher Learning Hub. This acknowledges the need for teachers to have a specified learning hub where their work can be honoured. The hub is a classroom for adult learners. It is currently being fitted out with completion expected early next year. The existing Data Walls used by staff to track and monitor student progress in literacy and numeracy have been relocated to the hub. These are used to focus staff learning on student next step learning and were previously located in a small office space in the main office. This

change means that the hub is now a student and parent free zone. All activities once held in Multipurpose Room 2 have been relocated to our new library space.

<u>Library</u>

Our exciting new library space is complete. This has been a long but exciting process. We now have a modern space that values the need for a library that engages students and provides teachers with a space that is learner focused. We look forward to having parent events in our completed space in Term 4.





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<u>Technology 2019</u>

We are currently investigating the feasibility of, Bring Your Own Learning Tool (BYOLT) for Stage 2 and 3 students in 2019. Many schools currently run the program which enables students to bring their own approved devices such as ipads and tablets to school. We have spoken to several local schools who are running the program and all report the positive impact of the program. Any BYOLT program would be voluntary with the school maintaining devices for shared use by students.We will be working to finalize our approach for 2019 knowing that many families are considering presents for Christmas at this time.



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Graffiti Education Visit

Last Wednesday morning stage 3 had a guest speaker named Xavier from Graffiti Education. He came to talk to us about the effects of graffitiing, peer pressure and disrespect. Our teachers brought him in to teach us in a new, entertaining and inspiring way.



The first thing Xavier talked to us about was the effect of graffiiting. He told us the effect it has on the person who did it, the victim and the victim's family. He then continued on about how when a building or communal place is graffitied on the whole aroma of the building and how it is perceived changes. The is horrible because if someone graffitied on a house the value of not just that house but the whole neighborhood deteriorates. If someone graffitied on a business the owners would lose all potential customers because it is ugly. He then informed us that some pieces are called 'Street Art' which is a legal form of Graffiti. To test our knowledge on what he had just taught us he showed different slides of pictures asking "Is it Street art or Graffiti?" The answers were quiet evident but we couldn't concentrate as we were captivated by the creativity and beauty of each Street Art example.

After talking about the effects that graffiti can bring on your life he got into how peer pressure can make you do things that can affect you in the long run. He told us that even if "Plan A" doesn't work there is always 'Plans B' through to Z. He also told us ways to get out of serious situations. For example Xavier said that there is an app called "Prank call". You can set a timer say for two minutes. After two minutes the app would make it seem like someone was calling you. Then you can walk outside and simply walk away from the situation you may have been stuck in. While explaining to us how to get out of a serious situation he also performed various skits that were hilarious and were a creative way to get his point across.

Xavier also brought in a character named Zed, who told us the story of his adolescent years and how interacting with the wrong type of people changed his life for the worst. This was helpful for all of us, students and teachers alike, because it helped us to realise that hanging out with the wrong people can ruin your whole life and send you to jail for years. This has now helped many of the students in Stage 3 to take a long hard look at themselves, think about who their friends are and decide whether they want to stay friends or not. It also helped because as we are going into High School, it will help us a lot when we are making new friends due to the fact that we will be able to tell if they are trustworthy or not, even though they are strangers that we have never met.

Overall, Xavier was hilarious, witty, entertaining and we all thoroughly enjoyed him. Everything we discussed was very serious but presented in a light-hearted, funny, innovative and captivating way. 'He was very funny and his message definitely set in.' 'He had very creative ideas.' 'We would love to see him again and have him teach us a new lesson.'

WHO DO YOU SAY JESUS IS?

Gospel in Life

We're tempted to applaud when Peter gives the right answer. The other disciples fumble around, giving Jesus the daily buzz about what people are saying about him. But when Jesus asks them what they personally think, only Peter has an answer. It's enough to make them want to cheer. Especially because Peter is so often the gospel bungler, the guy who speaks first, thinks afterwards. He's the guy, not unlike ourselves, who defends Jesus with a sword one minute, denies him with a word the next. And unfortunately, the same holds true in this instance as well. Even as we're tempted to clap, Peter is already shooting himself in the foot. He knew the right answer, but he can't follow through on it. He knows Jesus is the Christ, but he still doesn't want him to get hurt. And, the truth is, Peter doesn't want to get hurt either. If he accepts the teachings about the Son of Man being murdered, then he's got to wonder when they'll be coming after him. So Jesus calls him the Devil, which must have cut deep. And then advises that they too prepare to lose their lives if they're going to be his followers. Peter got the answer right, the first time. He, like the rest of us, just needs to work on the follow-through.

Do a little faith experiment. Trust God in every circumstance for one day. When things go awry, turn to God and not to your usual saviour. Find out how deep the waters of faith go.
