## From Our Principal

## Book Week

Two weeks ago we celebrated Book Week. The 2019 theme was 'Reading is my Superpower'. We celebrated the joy and gift of reading throughout the week. The annual book parade is always a fantastic celebration of the great characters found in children's books. The book parade is always an impressive display representing students ideas and parent ingenuity.
Our Year 4 and 5 students were asked to perform for the first time this year since beginning formal music instruments. This was an opportunity for the students to shine and show what they have learned. I was extremely proud of their performance. The staff from Captivate continue to do an amazing job as they continue to build a culture of music in the school. We are currently discussing how this program will look in 2020.

## Father's Day

On Thursday the 29th of August we celebrated Father's Day by holding an early morning BBQ breakfast, followed by prayer and an opportunity for dads to visit classrooms. The morning was well represented by our dads and grandfathers! I particularly noted the dads presence in the Book Fair purchasing reading material for their children.

A similar grant was accessed to pay for the basketball program students attended earlier in the term. These programs allow students access to professional coaching and equipment not owned by the school. A special thanks to Mrs Huntington for organising these programs.

A huge thank you to all the parents who are actively supporting the Spring Fair. The Spring Fair, formally our fete is the largest fundraiser for the school. All proceeds are used to purchase equipment that will benefit students. This year we will try something different by moving to a Friday night format. It's different and presents its own challenges, but it can and should be a successful community event. The Spring Fair depends on the support of all families.
