

celebration and at other times our children have
challenges that need to be discussed and addressed. As
a parent and a teacher when I attend my child's
interview I feel exactly the same and relate with our
parents.

Where We Learn and Grow Together

There can be confusion for parents about grades. Times have changed and a 'C' grade means a student is achieving stage outcomes. This is not the school experience of most parents and can cause some angst.

Reports are a time for learning for all students. The important link is children knowing from their parents what is expected and what needs to be achieved as we move into term 3. If this step is ignored or missed then the child ultimately misses out on the parental feedback that demonstrates a working relationship between home and school. As your child's first and foremost educators this step is vital.

The challenge can be supporting the school and your child's teacher when you may not agree. This is difficult, but teachers make the decision to report and be honest in the belief that this will help students to meet their full potential. They are not being mean or trying to cause conflict.

l would like to thank all parents who made the time to attend interviews and encourage those who have not met with their child's teacher yet to arrange a mutually appropriate time to discuss your child's progress.

I would also like to thank the staff for the considerable work that goes into preparing reports, the feedback for parents and for conducting interviews in their own family time.

This week students and parents will receive recognition of school attendance equal to or above 90% for Term 2. We all know the importance of positive attendance for students at school. Thank you to parents who are working with the school to improve individual student attendance rates.

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PBS4L


For the next two weeks our PBS4L focus is: "Be accountable and accept consequences for our actions".

Year 6 have received tokens for being learners, safe, responsible and respectful and are having a pyjama day to celebrate. Great job Year 6!








Please be reminded to look when you are parking in Wheeler Street. We have had complaints from residents that our parents / visitors are parking over


The theme for 2019 is 'Language. Place. Story.'

IT'S OUR JOB NOW TO FEED THE PEOPLE! Gospel in Life

l met an amazing young man one Christmas. Only 13 years old, he had organised a parish blanket drive that had collected dozens, maybe hundreds, of blankets for homeless people. His mum told me that he first wanted to organise the drive when he was seven, but that she told him to wait until he was older.

This young man is the perfect example of someone who seems to have learned from this week's Gospel. In the Gospel story, the disciples face a hungry crowd and seem confused.

They ask Jesus to do something. "Send them away", they say. But Jesus challenges them to do something. The result? The hungry people eat.

We have to remember that Jesus left our world, but Christ is still here. We are Christ's Body on earth. Each of us has a role to play in a world of hunger and hopelessness. We all have the power to make a difference. But we need to work together and seek Jesus' guidance.

So don't just pray for Jesus to help others. He isn't coming back until the end. It's up to you and me to do the hard work of changing the world until then.

Want world peace? Then pray for the ability to be a peacemaker. Want shelter for the homeless? Then pray for the guidance to help homeless people in your neighbourhood. Want healing in your family? Then pray for the strength to bring it yourself.

esus is still trying to feed hungry people. But we're his Body now. Let's do the work.

Who inspires you to believe you can help work Christ's miracles in today's world?
