#### From Our Principal

#### Coding Classes

At the start of this term we had organised Saoen to run coding classes as an extracurricular activity for all students from Year 1 to 6. Unfortunately these opportunities had to be postponed due to insufficient enrolment numbers. We strongly believe that this an exciting and worthwhile opportunity for all students and as such we have negotiated an alternate time for the classes to run later this term and Term 4. The only change being that all classes will be in the afternoon and spread over a four week period. This is a fantastic opportunity for students and I encourage all parents to enrol your children using the NSW Creative Kids Voucher.

#### Enrolments

We are currently enrolling for 2020. As you know St Bernadette's is a fantastic school that aims to provide a holistic Catholic education for students. We have many offerings including; focused learning opportunities for all students, well resourced school in terms of staff and equipment, an instrument program for all students in Year 4 and 5, Extracurricular sports opportunities including gala days, Indonesian classes for all students, an environmental team, Makerspace, expanded break time activities, modern library space, specialist interventions for vulnerable students, Positive Behaviour Support 4 Learning program, an active Parent Group and a strong Catholic school culture. We would encourage any families investigating school options for their children to visit St Bernadette's to have a school tour and a discussion about how we can support your child.

#### Where We Learn and Grow Together

#### Lockdowns and Evacuations

Last week the school practised one of our lockdown procedures. We practised a break time lockdown meaning students were moved into the library during lunch. Such rehearsals are a mandatory part of school life. An email message was sent to all parents informing them of the practice.

#### Playground Changes

You may have noticed some changes taking place in our playgrounds over the last few weeks. These changes will enhance the playground offering to students at recess and lunch and well as throughout the day. There are two significant structural changes currently taking place.

The existing garden area behind the office block is being relocated to the grass area behind Early Stage One. This space is currently unused and is more suitable to gardening as it receives a good amount of sun. To date fencing and a tap have been installed and the garden beds have been moved. We have plans to complete this area in the near future. In the coming weeks students will be asked to think of a name for our new garden space.

The old garden space has been cleared and will be turned into a breakout space. Next week some artificial grass will be laid in the space followed by some other additional equipment. This space will evolve over time. The space will be used to support students who find the playground challenging. More details will be provided as the space is completed

We have made significant changes to the primary playground by offering more opportunities for students to engage in physical activity. These changes have been a success and will remain in place.

We have purchased some equipment for the infants playground to assist students with alternate play options. The Woolworths Earn and Learn Stickers have been utilised to further support the infants playground with additional equipment purchases. Thanks to all families for collecting the stickers and returning them to school.

A special mention to Mr Fuller who has been working hard to make many of the structural changes take place. Also Ms Stapley who has been leading this initiative.

I'm sure many parents have noticed the new shade cloth installed at the Kiss and Drop area. In the coming weeks some existing seating will be re-located to this area for the students. This structure will add much needed shelter from the sun for students.

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#### PBS4L

Term 3, Week 3

This term we continue our journey with our Positive Behaviour Support for Learning Program (PBS4L). Our focus for the next fortnight is "Actively engage in tasks by listening, contributing and doing our personal best." Students will focus on listening and contributing to their learning and doing their personal best. This will allow them to learn new skills and constantly improve in all areas. Students will continue to receive Bluey cards and class tokens for their positive behaviour.

Last Thursday afternoon several staff members attended a professional learning course at Holy Family Primary School at Glenwood. The teachers were provided with collaborative professional learning through the sharing of ideas, experiences and learnings from different schools as they have implemented the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBS4L) framework. The teachers had an opportunity to physically view some of the PBS4L practices in other schools and to hear how the framework was developed within these schools. This was a valuable experience that will be shared and reflected on as a staff as we continue our own journey here at St Bernadette's.

#### **Special Projects - Playground**

This week we have been trialing changes to the Primary

playgrounds. The students have enjoyed the additional options for play time and have been exceptionally well behaved. A very big thank you to parents who have supported staff with these changes at home by speaking with your children. We will make any necessary amendments to the playgrounds following some

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#### **REC News**

On Thursday 8th August it is the Feast Day of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop (1842-1909). Mary MacKillop is not only the first Australian to be recognised by the Church as a Saint, she is truly a very Australian saint. She characterises the spirit of the Australian mythology. She was a prodigious hard worker who put the needs of others before herself. She exhibited something of the larrikin spirit: constantly in dispute with authority but pressing on, regardless. She used the strengths of others but also didn't tolerate those who were not genuine. Her commitment to the schooling of children from poor and rural communities established a model of Catholic education that continues to today. A Saint for and of Australia!



Next week on Thursday 15th August is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mary is our spiritual mother because we are members of the Church. Mary is in Heaven with Jesus. When she died God brought her straight to heaven, body and soul. This event is called the Assumption of Mary. In Heaven Mary prays to Jesus on our behalf. When we pray to Mary she brings our prayers straight to Jesus. Mary is always praying for our needs. Since the 5th Century there has been an active tradition and belief around the assumption of Mary. The tradition states that Mary was physically 'taken up' into Heaven at the end of her life. It is believed that her soul and her body remained united.

Parents and caregivers are invited to the upcoming Infants Liturgy this Friday 9th August and the Primary Mass Friday 16th August . Both are at 10am in St Bernadette's Parish Church. The students and staff would appreciate your presence at our liturgical events.

#### Road Safety

With the start of the school term it is a good time to remind everyone to take care on the road. Here are a few pointers:

Remind your children STOP, Look and Listen and Think before they step out on the road. This includes on pedestrian crossings and at traffic lights.

Anyone riding a bike or a scooter needs to wear a helmet and make sure that it is fastened firmly. This will reduce the injuries to their head if they fall off.



Make sure that everyone is buckled up in the car. Our local highway patrol report that many children are not buckled into in the correct car seats or the seats are not strapped into the car correctly. For more information or to find out about car seat checking events contact the Road Safety Officer at Blacktown Council.

Please obey parking restrictions around the school. No Stopping signs or continuous yellow lines mean you cannot stop in that area. This is to make sure that traffic can keep moving in narrow areas or to keep pedestrian crossings and intersections free so that vehicles and pedestrians can see each other. With your help we can keep everyone safe on the way to and from school.

This week a note was sent home about our Vocabulary Parade. This year each student will select a word that will

represent their costume. How could you represent words such as metallic, shimmering, prehistoric, calculator, energetic, geometry? Think about unusual words that others may not already know. You can recycle all sorts of items and costumes that you already have at home. Here are some examples:

You could choose a character from a book, a cartoon character, a movie character or a superhero and choose a word that best suits that character.

The students from K-6 were provided with hands on activities which were both entertaining and educational.

One night I was volunteering at a shelter when I found a large tray of hot dogs in the fridge.  Knowing the homeless guests were hungry, I handed out all the hot dogs.						
Another guest, James, arrived a little later.  Smiling, he asked me to heat up a few of his hot dogs.  Embarrassed, I realised that the hot dogs I had given out belonged to James.  I quickly apologised and offered to replace them.  He laughed at my mistake and said, "Don't worry about it.  As long as all the people ate, that's all I care about".						
James was the exact opposite of the man in Jesus' parable this week.						
This Gospel is important for us.  Our culture pushes us to buy nonstop and do whatever we can to get more money and more things for ourselves.  Some people joke at those who die with the most toys win.  That's an easy trap to fall into, but Winston Churchill once said something like "you make a living with what you get, but you make a life with what you give".						
A 'more for me' attitude can take over your life and kill relationships. This week's Gospel condemns greed, not because greedy people go to hell, but because greedy people construct their own hell on earth.
