Principal's Message

Welcome all to the 2020 school year! We especially welcome our new Kindergarten children, new students across the school and their families. We acknowledge your family's decision to entrust your child's education to the community of St Bernadette's. At St Bernadette's we value educating the whole child. As such we emphasise the spiritual, emotional, social and academic needs of each individual child.

appreciate that the new year brings mixed feelings to children and their parents. Each year is different, new teachers, new mix of students, changes to school and then their are the changes that occur outside of school. Some students take all these changes in their stride and show no concern whilst others require additional support to navigate their way through until they are comfortable with their new situation.

would also like to welcome back some of our existing staff who have been on leave. Mrs Buenaventura, Mrs Costaganna, Mrs Corrigan and Mrs Ellard all return in various capacities to class teaching roles. I also welcome Mrs Bonilla (Ms Xoshnow) and Miss Gibson to St Bernadette's. They are all readjusting to life at St Bernadette's.

This year we will continue to build on the good work we have been doing. Whilst there are no dramatic changes planned we are constantly refining what we are doing. This term we have introduced the following initiatives;

We have purchased the curriculum and implemented, Smiling Mind' to all classrooms. 'Smiling Mind is a preemptive mental health and wellbeing program.' This

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acknowledges the need for students to stop and be aware of their surroundings. It allows students to focus and meditate on aspects of their day and lives. As holistic educators we have been researching various programs that would suit the needs of our students and have settled on Smiling Minds. Parents who want to know more are encouraged to go to the Smiling Mind website or download the app. Parents can also do the home program which is totally free.

Our implementation of Positive Behaviour Support 4 Learning (PBS4L) continues. This term we are implementing whole school routines that will address how students enter learning spaces, how students move around the school, procedures for announcements and eating time. We are seeing some very pleasing results with the introduction of these routines. You're encouraged to ask your children about these new routines.

This term we are focusing on refining how we use de-escalation spaces in the classroom. Each space has a designated time out and calm space. Each class has been resourced to ensure calm down spaces provide the environment and tools that students need to de-escalate. As a staff we have worked on developing new procedures for their use in order to create a consistent approach across the school.

Eating areas have changed. Infants children now eat on the synthetic grass outside of the infants classrooms, Stage 2 continue to eat on the deck whilst Stage 3 have moved to the shade cloth near the flagpole. Outdoor furniture has been moved to reflect these changes.

I would like to thank parents for their support in getting students to their MAI numeracy assessment interviews at the start of the term. We are making great progress with the MAI assessments and should have these finalised for all students by the end of this week.

This year staff professional learning will continue to focus on generating more consistency of teaching practice throughout the school. We are on a journey that is yielding positive results in all areas. Our staff have high expectations for teaching and learning in all learning spaces. The Leadership Team is focused and working hard to build the capacity of staff to better meet the needs of all children.

Last year we introduced staff to student goal setting as a means of personalising learning and ensuring all students are making progress. This work will continue this year as we add more layers including, ensuring student feedback is highly effective to empower next step learning and opportunities for self and peer assessment are maximised. We have a full agenda of learning for staff which will continue to build the capacity of your school to better meet student needs.

As you may be aware we have returned to a few maintenance issues;

The library floor has been damaged over the holiday period and we are working with CEDP to assess the extent of the damage and the remediation work that is required. As a result we are limiting the use of the library. We hope to have more answers on the work required next week.

A number of air conditioners have failed over the christmas break. These are isolated to non essential areas and will be repaired.

We are currently investigating whether work is required to fix some parts of the infants softfall.

We look forward to working with you throughout 2020. A positive home / school partnership is essential to ensure students feel supported to meet their full potential. We strongly believe that parents are their child's first and foremost educators, you know your children well and we want to work with you to ensure 2020 is a successful year.



Welcome back to our 2020 school year. Our students have come back excited and well rested. This year we have some exciting things happening at St Bernadette's for Literacy.

Our school has again purchased an online subscription to Sound Waves, a synthetic phonics program to assist our students with reading and spelling. All students should have received their class login details where this program can be accessed at home. Please contact the class teacher or myself if you are unsure.



Teachers and students use this program during our Literacy block, with follow up activities that can be completed at home.

Students in Years 1- 6 follow the same sound sequence each week. So if you have students in different grades, they will all follow the same sound unit, at different levels. Below is the sequence of units for this term. Kindergarten will follow a different sequence, but also have login details where this can be accessed at home. Class teachers will send home login information for your child. Please contact the school if you are unsure of how to login at home.


