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Principal's Message

This is our last newsletter for what has been a very unique term. This term saw the single biggest interruption to traditional schooling in memory. COVID -19 continues to impact our daily lives.

Although a sense of normality has returned to school life we are still experiencing changes. We have gone a full term without any formal liturgical celebration. For a Catholic school where attending mass as a community is a part of our regular culture this is significant. These times are often part of a larger school celebration in which parents and families are welcomed into our school community. At these times students experience faith development from a whole community perspective that is lived and celebrated.

This week I have been contacting 2021 Kindy parents to conduct 'Meet and Greet' interviews. Significantly these chats can't occur in person due to the current restrictions. It is a very different and challenging way to welcome new families and try to understand their child's individual needs. I encourage parents who need to enrol their children for 2021 to do so and to continue to spread the good word regarding what St Bernadette's has to offer to prospective families.

Despite all the challenges this term has been an eventful term. St Bernadette's has been the recipient of some fantastic projects that have modernised our facilities.

We have a beautifully re-carpeted library that completes a refurbishment project that commenced in 2018.

We have a spectacular new Adventure Playground providing a purpose designed space for our infants students to play in during recess and lunch, but also for our primary grades to utilise during sport.

We have a purpose built Breakout Space for students to utilise.

We have new furniture including a Buddy Bench in the infants playground, table and bench in the Breakout Space and a new bike rack (yet to be installed).

Term 2 really was a term when many of our projects were completed!

This completes a long running project to address many of the playground challenges. The playground is now fully equipped with different spaces and resources for all of our students.

On behalf of all of the staff we thank families for their support during a very challenging time. Together we have achieved a lot! We hope everyone has a safe holiday break. Hopefully a time to truly relax and enjoy with the family!

Reports

Today parents will receive an email providing information on how they can access their child's Semester One Progress Report. Reports are now accessible online via the new Compass Portal. If you require a paper copy due to access limitations please let us know and one will be sent home.

As previously mentioned Semester One reports are simplified. The staff have worked hard to write comments for students in the areas of Religion, English and Mathematics. The comments are a snapshot of how students are progressing and some where to next points.

There are no formal Parent Teacher Interviews this semester. However, parents may request to speak with teachers and likewise teachers have been encouraged to contact parents where this is viewed as beneficial.

Uniform Expectations Update

I would like to acknowledge and thank all the parents who have provided feedback regarding the proposed hair and sport shoe changes. In the grand scheme of what we are trying to achieve at St Bernadette's it is interesting how something that we considered quite small would mean so much to so many people. As I have been told by many parents, "You're not going to please everyone!" and this is true. In this matter I believe everyone was given the opportunity to express their views and I have reached a decision after consulting with parents, staff, Father Andrew and staff from CEDP.

The feedback from parents was vast and varied. Some welcome the proposed changes whilst others are deeply opposed. Our aim in rewriting our hair style expectations is to ensure that;

- Students are not discriminated against based on gender, race, age, disability or religion.
- A balance between community expectations and anti-discrimination legislation is achieved.
- The ethos of the school is maintained.
- Expectations are reasonable and therefore enforceable

In making any change to school expectations we try to assess how the expectations will be interpreted and how the expectations may be ignored through 'loopholes'. For this reason I want to make it clear that if need be the new hair expectations will be reviewed and possibly changed in response to unforeseen issues. I also ask that parents follow the new expectations with integrity. I say parents because parents make choices about hairstyles and uniforms not students.

As such the following changes to hair expectations will be applied.

All student hair both girl and boy should adhere to the following expectations;

- Student hair is to be clean, neat and tidy at all times.
- Haircuts are to be in a sensible and conventional style. There are to be no extremes of fashion in hairstyle cut or colour. Shaving of any part of the head, lines or undercuts, and haircuts with a number 1 blade are not permitted. Rat's tails of any sort and the use of gel and hairspray to spike hair, is not permitted.
- If hair is below the collar it is to be tied back in a ponytail or bun.
- Hair must not restrict student vision..
- Hair colours, highlights and streaks are not acceptable.

Hair Accessories

- All hair accessories are to be yellow and blue (The blue should match the school uniform).
- **Large** hair accessories are not to be worn including but not limited to bows, scrunchies and headbands.

Sports Shoes

- Wearing predominantly white sports shoes will remain the school expectation. Colour should be limited.

During this process some other points have been raised and require clarification. Expectations for these items has not changed, these include;

- Black school shoes refers to leather school shoes. Black joggers are not acceptable as part of the school uniform.
- New school uniforms purchased through School Locker have embroidered logos on them. It is anticipated that over time that wearing embroidered uniform items will become the norm as old uniforms are replaced through wear and tear or as children grow.
- We have now transitioned from white socks to navy socks. Parents were given 2019 as a transition year to this new expectation.
- Watches are not permitted at school. This was implemented when smart watches became an issue in learning spaces and will remain in place.
- Makeup and nail polish is not to be worn

Winter Uniform Changes

A growing number of children wear beanies, gloves and scarves to school. I understand why parents have made this decision, but will be moving to bring consistency to what is worn. As such we have approved The School Locker to stock approved beanies, gloves and scarves that are correct in colour, style and embroidery. These will be available soon and will become the preferred option for 2020 until a full phase in 2021.

This term, Kindy have been mathematicians tackling challenging weekly problems in Maths, reflecting on God's creation in Religion and learning fun ways to read and write in English! It has been a HUGE term as Kindergarten students settled back into the classroom and picked up where we left off!

In History, we have been learning about storytelling and how we can make our own connections to stories through stories that are specific to our cultures and generations. This week, Kindergarten reflected on all their learning so far, and created their own stories to tell to other Kindergarten students. They decided that to make these more interesting, they could use props like puppets and costumes.

The teachers are so proud of all the learning that has been happening this Term and we can't wait for another amazing Term in a few weeks time! We hope you all have a lovely week!

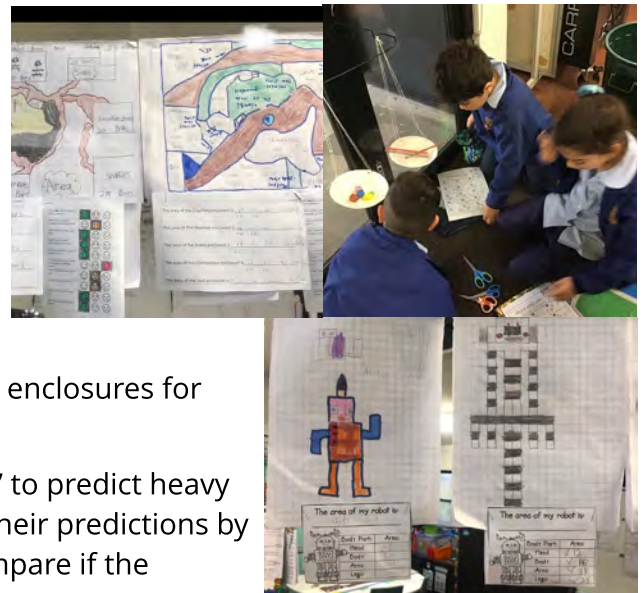
Message from Stage 1

Stage 1 students have been learning through hands-on activities for Mathematics over the last 2 weeks. In Week 7, students focused on the topic of area. They learnt that area is the size of a surface inside a 2D shape. Year 1 students used the week's knowledge to create robots and used a variety of strategies to count the total area of their creation. Year 2 created a map of a zoo! They were given 5 different sized animals and had to create suitable size enclosures for the animals and other parts of the zoo.

Last week, our topic was Mass. Students used 'hefting' to predict heavy and light objects around the room. They then tested their predictions by putting objects into pan balances to measure and compare if the objects were heavy, light or equal in weight.

It was wonderful to see students enjoying these topics and working in groups to build on their skills! We have been exploring the events of Pentecost. In particular, how the Disciples could not see the Holy Spirit but they could feel the wind blowing through the room and see the tongues of fire. This week Stage 1 made windmills which act as a symbol of our faith. They help us understand that although we cannot see the wind or the Holy Spirit, their power is all around us.

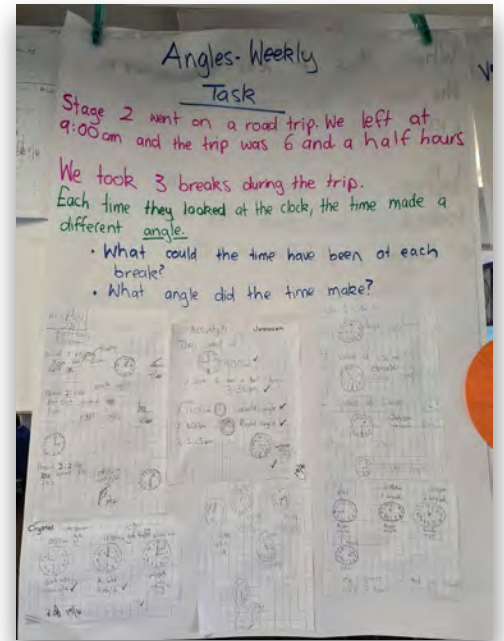
Last week, the stage 2 teachers were so proud of the students' learning. It was a week we stood back and admired the creativity and intelligence of each and every student. After a term of uncertainty, change and hardships, our students really challenged their thinking in all areas. In particular, in Numeracy. Stage 2 was investigating angles and how they are evident in

everyday life. We focused on clocks and the angles that are formed during various times. Stage 2 really shone during this learning, and it is a credit to them. 'Time' was a concept covered during remote learning, and we were amazed at how well they implemented this into their work with angles. It was enjoyable for the teachers to observe the exact moments students were proud of themselves for making the connections!

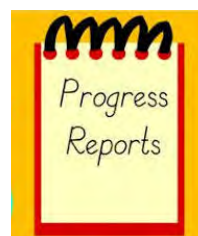
