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Principal's Message

Term 3 is considered the time when student learning all comes together. Students traditionally make significant learning gains in Term 3. This is because;

- Relationships between students, staff and parents are established
- Students know what is expected
- Students approach learning outcomes for the second time at a deeper level
- Students mature

However, the interruption to learning due to COVID-19 has had an impact on this timeframe. Students across the school have been affected at all different levels. End of Term 2 testing allowed teachers to gather current data on individual student learning, particularly in literacy. We are now using this data to minimise the impact of Covid- 19 on the long term educational outcomes of students. The data did affirm some of the outstanding learning that students did whilst at home with the support of families and friends. This is a testament to staff effort and importantly the huge efforts that families went to to support their children.

So what can families do to help minimise the impact? The single greatest thing you can do is read with and to your child each and every night. Commit 20 minutes to this process. Develop a love of reading with your child and help them to consolidate their reading skills. All students from kindergarten to Year 2 have free online access to PM readers online. This is a great resource that I'm personally using with my boys to support their reading. Download the APP and enjoy the books together. All other students should be receiving regular home readers to read.

We also need to acknowledge the social and emotional challenges faced by students and families at this time. There is a lot of anxiety in the community about COVID-19. Whilst we can't hide this from our children we as parents should monitor the information our children are accessing and the amount of time spent viewing content. Critically the most important step is to talk to your children, alleviate their fears, be honest and be positive.

Mrs Buenaventura has served the St Bernadette's community in many roles since 2007. She has held the position of Religious Education Coordinator for the past eight years. 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


Messages to all of our families from each Stage Group

The children have been learning some mapping skills and how to locate places on a map. The children used Ipads and chrome books to locate our school using Google Earth and Google Maps. They had so much fun locating different places and were so excited to see our school from an aerial view. The children also did some fieldwork out on the playground and had a go at drawing their own map of our school.







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Message from Stage 2

Stage 2 Celebration!

Stage 2 were very proud of their work recently in our space. Our 'Data' unit in Numeracy created a connecting opportunity with Literacy and Visual Arts. Students were given the task to collect data to design a new Nike shoe that would appeal to their audience. They created a survey, surveyed their peers and represented their data in





various ways. This process helped them understand what the audience was looking for and interested in! In Literacy, we looked at advertisements and how and why they are classified as a persuasive text. Students really enjoyed the discussions and tasks surrounding this concept, particularly using real life advertisements to analyse the various components. In Visual Arts, students sketched and finalised the prototype of their own designs using the data they collected in Numeracy. This was a huge success! Finally, students created and published their advertisements to sell their own Nike designs to the audience.



This was a huge success in Stage 2. Not only did the student enjoy participating in the whole process, the teachers thoroughly enjoyed the process unfolding and the students bringing it altogether! Well done Stage 2!

Message from Stage 3

Over the past two weeks, students in Stage 3 have been practicing their public speaking skills. Stage 3 focused on ensuring they were able to write engaging speeches for a specific purpose. Year 6 wrote speeches for Voice of Youth 2020



Sports Update

The current times have brought with it many challenges including our participation in external sporting opportunities. As we all can understand, keeping our children fit and active is an integral part of their growth and development. I have been working on a number of opportunities we can facilitate while keeping in line with COVID Safe guidelines.

On Friday 14th August the whole school will participate in an Athletics Fun Day at the oval. There will be two sessions and each activity will have a limited amount of participants to ensure we adhere to COVID Safe guidelines. As this is replacing the carnival we will still award house points for events and chant competitions. This will give the children the opportunity to participate in their house colour and also the Captains a chance to lead their teams.

Please make note of the following points to consider for the day.

- students are permitted to wear sport uniform with a their house team coloured shirt on the day. Hats must be worn
- no spectators are permitted.
- the day will be facilitated by staff with the help of Sport Captains.
- children will not have access to bathroom or drinking facilities at the oval and we walk back to school if needed.
- water bottles need to be sent to school clearly labelled with the child's name.
- we will be following our COVID-19 plan of cleaning equipment between use and have sanitiser stations available.

Starting in Week 6 all children will be participating in a fun football experience, encouraging participation and learning new skills. The five week program will be run by accredited coaches from Western Sydney Wanderers. This is a wonderful opportunity for the children to receive specialised coaching while brushing up on skills to use on our brand new soccer field.
