FR ANDREW'S EASTER MESSAGE 2021

Dear Friend, Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

Our icon depicts Jesus Risen standing triumphant holding the cross, the symbol of death defeated. To live the truth of the Resurrection, we must know through faith that Jesus has been raised up, our pledge that God has begun the destruction of all evil. Yet it is obvious that many evils remain in our world. Violence and greed fill our media. Misunderstanding, hurt, and disease still characterise at times in our lives. So, we await the complete victory of God in Christ. Our salvation is already' but 'not yet'. Proclaiming only 'Christ's victory', and our responsibility to help them. If we focus only on what is yet to come, it can undermine confidence in Christ's Resurrected presence. What makes us unique as Christians, is that we believe that God will save the world, through Christ. Faith looks backwards at the Resurrection, believing in the significance of its truth. Hope looks forward to what flows from that faith, knowing that what God has begun will be completed. Love keeps us in the present moment to oppose evil and to serve others in the power of Christ's Spirit. When our lives have been touched by sickness, betrayal, depression or death, the force of evil is real and personal. Christ's Resurrection says that God is opposed to the evil we suffer. We do not suffer alone, for Christ is with us. As we embrace the fullness of salvation coming in time, we gain strength from what has already taken place. Christ's Resurrection is not a matter of words but of reality. Since Christ has been raised up, God's will cannot be defeated. Christ's Resurrection, will ead to what is promised. This is why Jesus' Resurrection is the 'good news'.
