

Principal's Welcome Message

Welcome Back

I hope you had an enjoyable Christmas break. For me Christmas break is the opportunity I need to relax and recharge before the school year begins. Speaking to staff and students it's great to hear that so many of you managed to do some exciting things in our COVID restricted world. I've heard tales of fishing, beaches, pools, hotels, caravans, family and friends to mention but a few!

Teaching and Learning

As a staff we have been planning for a focused school year. We have been working hard to continue to refine teaching and learning. Our overall learning focus remains unchanged. We have been working for several years to ensure St Bernadette's has a strong learning culture. This learning is supported by;

- 1. Exceptional professional learning opportunities for all staff that is focused on our school goals.
- Accountable teaching and learning activities where teachers strive to ensure students achieve next step learning.
- 3. Data informed teaching where only best practice teaching and learning pedagogies are used.
- 4. Creating and maintaining a school environment that is safe and supportive.
- 5. A focus on whole child development.

These are all big items and we have plans in place to continue the work in order to achieve these goals. These include;

- 1. An approach to teaching and learning that is consistent throughout the school and that is understood and supported by the entire school Leadership Team. Work to improve consistency across the school is evident and our students and staff are responding positively.
- 2. We use the work of education experts including Lynn Sharratt and Michael McDowell to inform best teacher practice.
- 3. Wholes school programs including mindfulness, Positive Behaviour Support 4 learning and participation in iPlay Sport program for teachers.
- 4. Improving opportunities for students including the implementation of a gifted and talented program and employment of an Artist in Residence to support students artistic development.
- Support of CEDP specialist staff to support our teachers. We will have specialist support for Numeracy, English, Science, Religion and Creative Arts. Such staff will support staff to reflect on teaching and learning in order to improve practice.

Facilities Upgrades

This year we have two priority projects that will be completed.

- Partial refurbishment of our Kindergarten Learning Space. This will include new doors and access to the playground which will improve lighting and overall learning appeal in the space.
- 2. Installation of Solar Panels and LED lighting. This will reduce electricity bills and improve lighting in all spaces.

Covid Update

Covid continues to impact school and daily life. The most notable impact at the moment is the restriction to parent access to the school site. This is ongoing and will effect many events. We will keep you informed as restrictions change.

I want to thank our families for how calm and prepared students have began the year. The learning spaces are extremely settled and students are ready to learn. We have begun our formal Positive Behaviour Support 4 Learning lessons. Our expectations are reviewed and retaught each and every year. Take the time to ask your child about these lessons and support the school's approach to creating a safe and supportive school environment. This week our lessons focus on being a Safe school.

<u>Learning</u>

On Monday I did my first Instruction Walk through each of the learning space. An instruction Walk is a time when I visit each space with the purpose of assessing teaching and learning. This assessment informs next steps for school leaders and staff. My goal is to complete these walks daily at different times with a different focus. I was looking for consistency across stages and a sense of urgency to commence learning. It was affirming to see every class, including the new kindergarten students hard at their work. I saw a variety of numeracy and literacy lessons in all spaces. This is a testament to our staff who understand the need to get focused learning underway as a priority.

I feel privileged to be leading St Bernadette's. This is my fifth year as Principal and my fifteenth year at St Bernadette's. In this time I have seen many changes. Our school community has evolved and it's fair to say that not too much has remained the same. Change is a part of what we do. This year will be no different.

I thank you all for choosing St Bernadette's to be the partner in your child's education. I believe St Bernadette's is a great school and we even better with each and every child, family and staff member as a part of our community. We look forward to the year a head supporting your students as they continue to learn and develop as individuals.

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ST BERNADETTE'S DRESS CODE

The student dress code consists of an agreed standard and items of clothing that students at St Bernadette's must comply with when:

- attending or representing their school
- traveling to and from school
- engaging in school activities out of school hours

The Student dress code reflects school community standards and balances the rights of individual students with the best interests of the whole school community. Student dress codes clearly explain and document standards of acceptable or reasonable dress in relation to:

- clothing worn by students, including headwear and footwear
- other aspects of personal presentation of students

In the instance of hardship support, assistance can be provided where there are difficulties in complying with school uniform and dress code requirements.

The following Student Dress Code applies at all times:

- Sport shoes/joggers are only to be worn on sport days.
- Haircuts and hairstyles should be **sensible**, neat and tidy, no hair colours, highlights, streaks or unusual styles are allowed. This includes rats tails, stripes and the excessive use of gel, etc.
- Long hair needs to be tied back.
- Junior navy blue ribbons, scrunchies and hair clips may be worn.
- NO ornate or SHARP hair clips to be worn.
- **NO** anklets, plaited cords or beads to be worn
- NO nail polish

GIRLS – appropriate jewellery consists of:

- signet ring
- sleeper or stud earrings (one on each ear only)
- A simple religious chain may also be worn

BOYS – appropriate jewellery consists of:

- signet ring
- simple religious chain may also be worn
- Boys are NOT allowed to wear an earring

We would appreciate your help in ensuring your child/children comply with the school's dress standards. We understand that the students are often incapable of making or organising the necessary changes in order to be compliant and so need your help. We expect all students to meet the above standards by Week 3. If you have any foreseen difficulties in doing this please contact your child's teacher or Principal.

If at any time you are unable to send your child to school in the correct uniform it would be appreciated if a note was provided detailing the issue and when we can expect it to be rectified.

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Parking Around The School

It has been brought to our attention that a number of parents are not adhering to the road rules or school expectations when dropping off or picking up children.

Gardenia Grove

It is a long held expectation that parents not park in Gardenia Grove. This is the school's designated Kiss and Drop area and should be kept clear of all other school traffic. Parents are asked not to park in this street so that kiss and drop can run smoothly.

Additionally when waiting in the kiss and drop line parents must adhere to the road rules. These include not waiting in the bus zone, on the curb, across resident and school driveways or in no standing zones. Currently the parking signs in Gardenia Grove state "No Parking" between 8:30am - 9:30am and 3:00pm - 4:00pm. This means any parent arriving before 3:15pm in the afternoon are at risk of parking fines. We encourage you to arrive after 3.15pm when the Kiss and Drop line will be moving.

Wheeler Street

Wheeler Street is a busy street during school drop off and pick up times. Drivers must adhere to the road rules including not doing u turns in front of the school. Additionally parking in the bus zone, on curbs or across resident driveways is illegal. It is also suggested that drivers turning right into Gardenia Grove from Wheeler Street do not block Wheeler Street while waiting to turn.

Of most importance is the safety of the children. The road rules and school expectations are in place to keep everyone safe. Saving a few minutes of your time could have severe consequences for others.
