Principal's Welcome Message

Welcome to week 4! The term is certainly progressing very quickly.

On Wednesday we celebrated Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. It was fantastic that we were able to have a liturgy with each stage and equally disappointing that members of the community were not allowed to join us. The purpose of Lent is to prepare for Easter by repenting for our sins. Many of us make the decision to give something up as a symbol of sacrifice and self discipline. It acknowledges Jesus's ultimate sacrifice for us. As the students take part in this process I think it is a good opportunity for families to work together, keep things achievable and celebrate the daily successes.

We have certainly settled into the normal school routine. I'm proud of how well our students are doing at this early stage of the year. This affirms my beliefs in our staff who work so hard for this community. It also affirms the hard work we have done over many years to imbed Positive Behaviour Support 4 Learning across the school.

l want to thank parents who have taken the opportunity to either meet or have a phone call with teachers. This is a great opportunity for parents to discuss the needs of their children with staff. I encourage any parents who feel there is a need to discuss their child to make that commitment and contact the school to arrange a suitable time.

The official opening of 2022 Kindy enrolments is fast approaching. Parents are encouraged to contact the school for an enrolment pack or to attend our upcoming open evening on the 9th of March at 6pm. This will be an opportunity to tour the school and ask any questions. Encourage your friends to attend and see the great work that happens at St Bernadette's.

Students in Stages 2 and 3 are completing the AGAT test. The AGAT is an ACER standardised test used to measure students' general intellectual ability. The test is designed to assist teachers in their assessment of students' learning potential and overall aptitude. We will use this data to inform which students will be selected for our Gifted and Talented programme. Parents of such children will be notified. We are excited by this new offering for our students and its potential as an ongoing school programme.

From this week our regular Friday assembly will move to Thursday. This will ensure students who do gymnastics on Friday morning do not miss out on the assembly. We will revert back to Friday assembly in Term 2.

This week we have met with builders who will be carrying out renovations to our Kindy classrooms. The work has been approved by all parties and is scheduled to take place in the Easter school holidays. This work will modernise the space. Additionally we have also met with the team who will be installing solar panels on the roof and new lighting throughout the school. As it stands this work is scheduled to be completed in May / June and will not affect students. We are assured the new lighting will make a significant difference to our learning spaces and the solar panels will reduce operating costs.

Numeracy with Mrs Buenaventura

Greetings Parents, Caregivers and friends.

Week 4 and the students have been participating in great Numeracy learning. The teachers have been working hard to challenge the students to ensure they are understanding what the Maths is, what strategy is the most efficient and to prove their thinking.

As Numeracy lessons are hands-on and at times collaborative with peers, a great counting activity you can do is handfuls. Encourage your child to get a handful of items, estimate their quantity, count the collection in the most efficient way and record. Not only is recording their thinking a great way to consolidate their

learning but you are also encouraging your child to strengthen their reasoning skills. From here you can double the number, plot their numbers on a numberline or even discover its multiples. I would love to see your hard thinking, I invite you to email the school your work! Have a go, and invite various members of your family to get a handful of items for your child to count.

EXPLORING THE WORD

The Baptist had promised that Jesus would baptise with the Holy Spirit and at his baptism the Holy Spirit had descended on him. Now that same Spirit drives Jesus into the wilderness. He is not the master of his own destiny. He is the object of the action of God. There is no murmur of opposition to this. Jesus accepts God's Spirit and God's will. As a consequence, the harmony of creation is restored and Jesus 'is with ' the wild beasts. It is a fulfilment of the prophecy of Isaiah that ' the wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, and the calf and the lion and fatling together' (Is 11: 6-7) The new creation has begun in the person of Jesus, the Christ, the Son of God. Indeed, he proclaims that the Kingdom of God is close at hand. But Jesus also summons his followers to repent and believe the good news. Lent is a time to listen attentively to the gospel and to turn back to the ways of the Father. It is a time for us to consider how close we are to the Kingdom of God.

• Jesus heralds the new creation. What would be the perfect world for you? Describe what might be different from our present reality in the Kingdom of God. How can you help to bring this about?
