#### Principal's Welcome Message

Our major focus this week has been supporting the Year 3 and 5 students whilst completing their NAPLAN assessments. The students are to be commended for their positive attitude and for doing their best! The results for NAPLAN will be available to parents and schools in Term 3 typically from mid-August to mid-September. The results are a snapshot of student achievement and will need to be considered with many variables. A few variables that we have noticed throughout this years process include;

- Some students have finished the tests very quickly.
- Students are reluctant to use the working out paper. The assessments are online meaning students have to make the decision to work answers out using paper prior to selecting an answer online.

Next week we farewell Miss Antonelli. Miss A as the students know her as made the decision to take up a permanent Teachers Aide role in a specialist school. Miss A has been a valued member of the school community for many years. She has supported many students in her time at St Bernadette's and she is wished all the best in the future.


Being a mother is truly a gift from God and although we have many daily roles that range from taxi driver to referee...the unconditional love we receive from our child or children is the best reward!







#### TIME TO GO!

#### **Gospel in Life**

Time to go'. We all know what that means. If you come from a family like mine, it means we're entering into a period of good-byes that make us loiter in the doorway for another half hour.

Sooner or later, though, we're going to finish that final conversation, give that last hug, say that last I-love-you, and wish the travellers a safe journey home. And then they're gone.

For a moment, there's an almost visible space in the room shaped just like Aunt Elsie and the kids. That same shaped emptiness is curiously echoed in the heart. Even the silence sounds curiously like the folks who have just left.

The disciples standing around after the Ascension must have experienced something like that. A Jesus-shaped space where he stood, a Jesus-sounding silence where he'd spoken. There was a space in their hearts, too, that would always long for him to fill it.

And yet the same must have been true of them as it is for us, when we take leave of our loved ones. Their absence remains brilliantly in their absence. They're not here but are hardly gone for good. You cannot kill love off that easily. Love never leaves the room.

How do you keep Jesus even when he may seem absent? We respond .......

Consider the Jesus-shaped place in your life.Is it big enough, profound enough, life-changing enough?

How can you proclaim the Gospel to parts of creation other than human beings?

Think about a story in the news that did not happen close by.

How can you bring God's love to the situation from so far away?

#### **FAMOUS LAST WORDS**

Toward the end of Jesus' earthly ministry it became inevitable ..... Jesus would physically be taken from their midst. What would happen to the movement so recently begun? If it was to be carried on with power, the little band of disciples stood in special need of prayer. So Jesus offered the High Priestly Prayer, and asked God to grant them the same marks of the Spirit we need today.

In that prayer Jesus stressed three things, first, he wanted them to know the Christian Gospel, not simply as a pretty story, but as God's truth. Second, he prayed for them to be ready to bear witness to that truth by testifying in all areas of life. Finally, he desired they be a people who find joy by fulfilling God's call.
