
Marble Run Family Challenge

Managing Screen Time

For many kids during lockdown, screens have become the primary source of entertainment and social connection. In preparation for the school holidays, here is some research based advice on managing screen time:

Find out what your child is doing online

Many neurologists refer to the brain as 'plastic'. This is because the activities we engage in and the experiences we have can shape and shift how our brain works. Video games and social media content has the potential to impact a child's brain development. Children need adults to help monitor their choices in video games and apps.

Ensure screen time is balanced with time outside

Many concerns around screen time are related to eye health, posture and sedentary behaviour. Rest breaks and time outside can balance out some of these effects. Perhaps your family could introduce a system where additional screen time can be earned for every 20 minutes outside.

Timing is important

Screen time as soon as kids wake up can jump-start the brain like an electric shock. Screen time just before bed can have a similar effect, rather than calming down before sleep, the brain remains energised. Try to encourage your kids to use screen time during the day rather than the first and/or last activity they engage in.

Model healthy screen use

If your kids are able to see you take breaks from technology at different times in the day, they are more likely to do the same.

An increase in screen time is an inevitable part of lockdown. These holidays, I encourage you to help keep screen time as positive and safe as possible. Enjoy the break!
