Tell Them From Me (TTFM) Survey

The TTFM survey was an opportunity provided to all parents late last term to help inform the future direction of the school. It was affirming to see that so many parents took the time to complete the survey and ensure they had a say. Overwhelmingly the teacher, student and parent response was very positive. We have a great school and this was reflected in the survey results.

The survey has provided us with a number of future directions, most of which we had already identified and are currently conducting our own inquiries into future directions. These will be shared at a later more appropriate date when staff return to normal duties and are able to spend time working on these big picture future directions.

Some parents raised some points that require some explaining regarding processes and the like. As a way forward we will add regular content to the newsletter to address these issues and improve community understanding.

School Communication Channels

The school has well established communication platforms in place. These were developed with the assistance of the system's marketing team. Our platforms were designed to;

- Be sustainable. Our teacher's primary role is to teach students. They are required to add content to our various communication platforms, but this is managed to ensure it is sustainable and does not affect teaching or the planning of teaching.
- To have clear pathways for different communication.
- To establish digital communication platforms and limit paper copies
- To phase out the newsletter. This is planned to occur later this year or early 2022.
- To enable this we use the following platforms;

The school website provides;

- An overview of the school and what it offers
- Copies of the school newsletter
- The 'latest news' section contains regular articles from staff regarding student learning and events.
- Various forms, photo galleries and important information for parents. The website contains lots of information and is a good starting point for parents when questions arise.
- Facebook is utilised to provide immediate good news stories about the school community. Posts are frequent and aim to provide the community with information about events or the like as they occur. During covid and times of emergencies it is utilised to publish important information that parents require particularly over weekends when other platforms cannot be updated.
- We use the Parent Portal on Compass as a means of publishing notes for families and providing access to Student Progress Reports. Parents receive a notification through email informing them that a new item is available. This is our primary source of communicating important information to parents. These emails occur as required and it is essential that parents regularly check their emails. The Compass Portal will increasingly be a means of communicating with parents as further functionality is opened including payments and permission slips.
- This year we did a trial using google classroom as a means of sharing and celebrating individual student work. In our review of this trial it was identified that access by parents was limited. This task took considerable staff time to do and as such is currently under review to identify any changes that may improve parental access.

We are not looking to expand the platforms we use. Our primary goal is to have sustainable practises that are manageable by staff.



Tokyo Olympics


