Principal's Message

To all Parents / Guardians

The current lockdown and associated restrictions are set to continue until August 28th meaning that remote learning will continue for at least another 3 weeks. Like everyone we are unsure of how learning will look or even if the lockdown will end.

We are happy with the current remote learning being offered across the school. On the whole stages have consistent support in place for all students. We have achieved a good balance by live zoom lessons and pre-recorded lesson content. We will maintain this current offering as it is manageable by both families and staff.

It is worth noting that our Stage 1 and 3 teaching teams are currently on site supervising students. This is impacting their ability to provide live zoom events and will remain so as long as the Blacktown LGA is in lockdown.

Staffing News

It is sad to announce that Mrs Park will be leaving St Bernadette's at the end of this week. Mrs Park returned to St Bernadette's this term, but has decided to take up a classroom teaching role in another Catholic school. We thank Mrs Park for her commitment to our community over the last 6 years.

We are pleased to announce that Mrs Graham, an experienced teacher, will be joining the Science Team next week. Mrs Graham has taught in a number of CEDP schools and brings with her a wealth of experience. This is a challenging time to join a school community but I'm sure you will do your best to support her transition to St Bernadette's.

High School Enrolments

High school enrolments for 2023 are open. Families with students currently in Year 5 should be on the journey to formally enrolling their child in high school. This means parents and their child should be actively looking at and discussing potential high schools. In the current covid lockdown situation most of the information gathering will need to take place by looking at schools online, talking to friends and the school if required.

Enrolling into high school needs to be a priority for families. The staff at St Bernadette's are able to assist where required. To be clear, staff at St Bernadette's can assist in the enrolment process, but we cannot do it for you.

Don't risk missing out. Most Catholic Secondary schools fill up fast and once full your only option is to go on a wait list.

Reporting Student Progress

In the Tell Them From Survey some parents expressed concerns regarding how student progress is reported to parents.

Every school is required to provide a progress report at the conclusion of Term 2 and 4. That's two formal progress reports a year. This is mandated across all schools and we are audited to ensure this occurs.

At St Bernadette's we use Compass, the student management system to write reports and then make them available to parents. This occurred in 2020 and 2021 for all students. Covid did not stop this last year although reports were simplified. Parents were advised that Compass would be our new communication tool and were provided with instructions regarding access.

Progress reports use a five point scale to report student progress. Formally students received an A - E grade, but we now use language such as achieved, working towards or working beyond to report student progress.

All reports break each Key Learning Area such as English and Mathematics into their respective strands as per the NSW Syllabus. For example for English this is Writing, Reading and Speaking and Listening. Students receive a grade for each strand and then an overall grade for the Key Learning Area. This is standard reporting practise in NSW schools.

Outside of the Progress Reports parents can seek progress information throughout the year from their child's teachers. At times teachers will also contact parents to discuss any concerns.



St Bernadette's Primary School Zoom Expectations:

Student acceptable use of Zoom classroom:

- Zoom learning space is quiet and clear of distractions where possible, with a parent or quardian present.
- Come dressed in neat and tidy clothes.
- Video screen is turned on and microphone turned off unless directed by teacher.
- Be engaged in the session. This would include active listening, asking questions and participating in the learning task. No eating during the session.
- Expectations used at school also apply in a virtual classroom, and students who display
 poor or unacceptable behaviour will be asked to leave the zoom.

This will be uploaded onto all Stage Google Classrooms and explained in your child's next parent zoom meeting.

each of our teachers. This online resource provides your child to access activities that are


linked to the weekly Numeracy learning outcome. All the activities are organised by each of the stage teachers, which will be changed each week.



I wouldn't be surprised if by this point, everyone has had at least one 'COVID-cry'. Whether you're a teacher, a parent or even a school counsellor, there are many emotions to deal with when you're stuck inside for extended periods of time. For many, the primary emotion is anxiety which seeps out in all different ways. Some of us feel foggy headed and can't complete work tasks, some of us become snappy and intolerant of others and some of us don't have the luxury to think about how we feel and are pushing through each day like cadets in training.



Helpful Tips

- 1) Making a daily routine including connecting with people outside your home reduces stress levels
- 2) Exposure to misinformation and unhelpful media induces feelings of panic and alarm
- 3) Looking after your body by getting enough sleep, eating well and avoiding excessive alcohol protects your mental health

- 5) If you're not coping, get professional advice

Literacy with Mrs Maher

Hi everyone!

Hope you are all well and coping with remote learning. To all the parents and caregivers of our beautiful St Bernie's children, I'd like to say thank you, for all that you are doing to support what our dedicated teachers have planned for them. These are very testing times and for all of us, a juggling act.

guess we will look back on this time in some ways as a gift, a time where we got to spend a great deal of teaching and learning time with our own children.

There are many learning tools set up for your children to continue along on their literacy learning journey remotely, here are some reminders of a few.



Sound Waves Spelling is our online whole school phonics program. All students from K-6 have a year group login. Students can access online games and activities to further improve their spelling and phonemic awareness. Each week, students work on a specific sound/phoneme and work on activities to match the sound with the grapheme/letters that represent the sound.



PM eCollection - All students in K-2 have a username and password to access levelled texts online. This valuable resource allows your children to access a huge selection of texts at your child's reading level. Your children can listen to books, read books and record themselves reading. This resource allows our teachers to keep track of what your children are reading and set books at their reading level.



SORA is a collection of EBooks and audiobooks for children of all ages to access texts remotely.

Reading

It is important that your children are reading for at least 20 minutes daily. Daily reading improves vocabulary, concepts, comprehension and oral language. Read to your child, model yourself as a reader, listen to them read and talk about texts with them. Your child's teacher has set reading for them, it is so important to support and continue this with them at home.



Writing

The teachers have made videos and organised teaching zooms for writing lessons. Students need to engage with these lessons as skills can so easily be lost. At this point we are unsure of when face to face teaching will resume, so it is very important for your child to access the learning on their Google Classroom. If you are having difficulties accessing the learning please phone the school, we have a very dedicated team ready and willing to help

Writing can take place in many different ways, children can write a shopping list, label things around the house, write emails to friends and family, keep a daily journal, write recipes of things they are cooking with you, write letters to friends that can be posted, the list is
