Principal's Message

Welcome to Term 4! This is a term filled with hope as we approach the time when some of life's normalities return.

I'm sure there will be mixed emotions regarding the return to school plan. I'm also sure there are many questions. At this stage we can only communicate what we know. Unfortunately we learn many of the changes through the media at the same time as the rest of the community.

What we do know is the return to school plan has changed and as such students will return to school on;

- Monday 18 October Kindergarten and Year 1 students return to face-to-face learning.
- Monday 25 October All other students will return to face-to-face learning.

Parents were emailed a link to a survey to complete to allow us to plan for the return to school. Could all parents please complete this survey.

We are seeking clarity regarding the return to school plan. One of our main issues is that St Bernadette's is organised in stages not year groups, but as of writing this we have no clarity regarding the possibility of changes. This will pose some major challenges for us with our teachers engaged in onsite learning while half the stage are at home doing remote learning.

Importantly, students do not return next week. Next week there will be minimal supervision at school for essential workers only.

Upon the return to school our focus will be;

- To provide opportunities for students to re engage with their peers
- To maximise learning time spent on literacy and numeracy
- To maintain religious education
- To assess the impact of remote learning on student progress. This will take time and formal assessments will not occur until later in the term.

The return to school can be a highly emotional time for students. It is important that parents begin to have discussions with their children to communicate timelines and expectations for the return. Leaving this to the day of return could lead to a highly charged emotional meltdown. Importantly assure your children that school is a safe place. Talk to them about their anxieties and provide solutions to any issues.

COVID Restrictions

Current restrictions mean that upon returning to school parents are not permitted on the school site. This means parents must stay outside of the school gates during morning drop off and can only access the top playground during pick up. Parents are encouraged to make use of the kiss and drop service. Parents are advised not to mingle outside of the school gates and to maintain social distancing.

Students may bring small bottles of hand sanitiser and wear a mask if parents deem appropriate. Wearing of masks is not

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mandatory for children under the age of twelve and parents should teach their children how to wear and take off masks.

Sick Students

Students should not be sent to school when sick. If students attend school or become ill whilst at school parents will be notified to immediately pick them up. Sick students will be isolated from other members of the school community.

Uniforms

Upon return to school all students are expected to wear full summer uniform. Parents are able to order uniforms on the School Locker website and can either have items delivered or pick up from the school office. The School Locker has added sizing charts for all items and advise that return due to incorrect size is fine provided the item is in original condition. Unfortunately students are unable to try on items at this stage.

At this stage we are unable to confirm sport days.

Staffing Update

As we move towards the end of the year our 2022 staffing is beginning to take shape. It is important that parents understand that St Bernadette's has a high amount of temporary staff who are seeking permanent employment. This leads to some inevitable change at the end of the year.

This week we welcome Mrs Pizarro Arenas as a new Teacher's Aide supporting Stage 1. Mrs Pizarro Arenas has extensive early education experience in a preschool setting and is currently studying to be a Primary Teacher. She will be working Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

At the end of 2021 Ms Barrak will be leaving St Bernadette's to continue her teaching journey in another Catholic school. Ms Barrak has worked at St Bernadette's for 7 years in many capacities and is thanked for her contributions to the school community. We wish her well in her new position.

We are currently employing new teachers for 2022 and will share details of appointments soon.


Science News
