Principal's Message

This week the school came alive as we welcomed back Kindergarten and Year 1 students. The silence was broken with the hum of excited and happy children. A highlight of this week has been the huge smiles on the children's faces particularly when they first entered the school gate. It was great to see that the overwhelming majority of students have returned to school as planned.

Next week the remainder of the students will return to school and St Bernadette's will be alive once again. We look forward to welcoming the rest of our students back!

We have planned a significant focus on the emotional and social needs of the students. They will be engaged in lots of activities that encourage playing together and putting into practice the social skills they learn in class. These times will also serve to allow students to reconnect with their peers.

COVID safe measures have been fully implemented in school. We ask that you continue to talk to your children to ensure they understand why things are as they are. For example;

Staff have met to discuss other opportunities to mark this significant occasion for our year 6 students.

Last week interviews were held to appoint an Acting Assistant Principal for 2022. I'm very pleased to announce that Mr Mark Galea has been appointed. Mr Galea is currently working at Holy Trinity Catholic Primary School, Granville as The Religious Education Coordinator. He has previous experience as an Acting Assistant Principal in the Diocese and has extensive teaching and leadership experience across multiple Catholic primary schools.

It has come to our attention that a number of children have watched Squid Games at home. Squid Games is rated MA and therefore is not appropriate for children. Parents are advised to check your Netflix settings to ensure children cannot access this series without your consent. At school we have had incidents of students copying the games in inappropriate ways. Staff are being vigilant to monitor and stop such games. Parents will be contacted if instances are ongoing. If your child has watched the series we ask that you discuss that copying the content is not appropriate for school.

With students returning to school this week and next week it is especially important to talk to your children about what it looks like to be a safe, respectful, responsible, learner. Like all of us adults, our children have been stuck at home and some may need reminding of what it looks like to display positive behaviour at school.

Each day at school upon the students return we will be focusing on the different parts of the matrix. As well as the PBS4L matrix we will be unpacking important social skills; communicating, collaborating, problem solving and self awareness. These are some skills we as a staff felt were important to relearn upon our return to school and ones we may be out of practice with after so many months at home.

Please spend some time each day discussing the PBS4L and social skills focus with your child.


Introducing QKR! Payment System


Please note: Payments for School Fees cannot be made on QKR!. Current arrangements for school fees have not changed.

School Travel for 2022



2022 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2022 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for a school travel pass for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, or who have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications and current entitlements are updated and remain valid. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

<u>Term Bus Pass</u> holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2022.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

School Student Transport Scheme site change

On 1 October 2021 the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) information and application portal was moved to **transportnsw.info**. This will assist families to find all their travel information in the one place.

Travel from Term 1 2022

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) open at the start of Term 4 2021 for travel in 2022, so parents/students can apply or update details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a difficult period for local bus operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations increasingly difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel on a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Please also remember that students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Student code of conduct and Opal terms of use.




