National Child Protection Week

Children have the right to grow up in environments that support them according to their needs, now and into the future. In schools we are guided by the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards and we are supported also by the National Principles for Child Safe Organisations.

We can all work together to make sure every child in our community has a fair go and we can do this by ensuring that our children:

- feel loved and safe
- have a positive sense of their identity and culture
- have material basics
- are healthy
- learning
- participating in activities.

Before the end of the term all the students will be involved in activities in their learning spaces to assist them in making important decisions about their safety.

<u>NAPLAN</u>

Next week the students in Year 3 and Year 5 will bring home a confidential report on their progress in the National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assessments.

The NAPLAN assessments provide parents and teachers with information about the children's learning in Literacy and Numeracy. Please take the time to sit with your child and read the report and celebrate your child's successes. Where there may be areas identified as challenges, use this time as an

opportunity to discuss possible goals with your child. As the children sat the NAPLAN tests early in May it is possible that the children may have mastered challenges identified in the report.

If your child is in Year 5 please keep your child's NAPLAN results in a safe place as you will be required to provide them for your child's High School enrolment.
