NAPLAN Message

NAPLAN testing will occur for all students in Year 3 and 5 in Week 3 of this term. NAPLAN is a standardised test that is used by the school to better inform future learning. NAPLAN often affirms what we already know about individual students.

At school we are preparing students for the assessment. We do recognise that it is one test and we do not advise pressuring students to do anything more than their best. As we prepare for NAPLAN talk to your child about doing their best, assure them and remain positive. On NAPLAN days it may help to have a strong routine that limits stress in the morning. Have discussions at night that focus on your child informing you. Be positive about your child's responses and support them through the week.

Staffing

We welcome back Mrs Ellard to the St Bernadette's community after maternity leave. Mrs Ellard will be supporting students throughout infants.

Winter Uniform

As the weather shifts and the cold weather begins parents are advised that we are transitioning to full winter school uniforms. It is expected that all students will be in full winter uniform to commence week 3. This includes black leather school shoes, school jackets or jumpers and hats.

Student Attendance

Student attendance at school is crucial. Having just five days off a term results in a child missing a full year of education by the time they reach Year 10. Illness and mandatory isolation due to COVID have had significant impacts on student attendance. We are now working at ensuring parents know if their child's attendance is a concern. To be clear we do not want students at school when they are ill. However, we are required under legislation to ensure parents understand that regular attendance at school is important and at times to support families to improve attendance. If attendance is at a critical level further steps may be necessary including an Attendance Plan, family liaison and interventions external to school.
