Last week we celebrated Pentecost Sunday. On Pentecost we celebrate the Holy Spirit descending on the disciples and giving them the ability to preach the gospel to everyone. Our challenge as Catholics is to live a life where these gifts are evident and witnessed in our daily lives

Semester 1 Reports

Staff are currently focused on writing and finalising student Semester One Progress Reports for all students. Writing reports is a precise art that takes teachers a lot of time to complete and master. At St Bernadette's we have weekly accountabilities for staff that need to be met so progress reports are completed to a high standard as per whole school expectations. In years one to six we use a five point grading system. All NSW Syllabi are written in stages which correlates to how classes are structured at St Bernadette's. This means that with the exception of ES1 (KINDY) students have two years to master syllabus content. For example, students in year 3 and 4 work off the same syllabus for Mathematics and have two years to master expectations. In a practical sense this means students in odd year grades, years 1, 3 and 5 have just begun to work on the syllabus outcomes and as such have only spent two terms attending to this learning. Students in even years 2, 4 and 6 have been working on syllabus learning for one and a half years and have had more opportunities to master syllabus requirements.

This is reflected in student grades. Students are measured against syllabus outcomes. Sometimes parents feel worried about their child's grade, however this anxiety needs to be directed to asking the right questions for example; Is my child's learning on track? Is there anything we should be concerned about? Or How can we support our student's learning progress?

A measured approach to discussions with children is also important. Accepting students progress at a point of time and working with staff to continue learning progress. At St Bernadette's we concentrate on next step learning. This means what needs to happen now to continue learning progress.

Early stage one students have their own syllabus to work from. Syllabus outcomes should be achieved in one year. Semester One's report will reflect progress so far, but we need to emphasise that students have the rest of the year to achieve outcomes.
