National Sorry Day and Reconciliation Week

On Thursday the school community acknowledged National Sorry Day. National Sorry Day is a day to acknowledge the strength of Stolen Generations Survivors and reflect on how we can all play a part in the healing process for our people and nation. While this date carries great significance for the Stolen Generations and other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, it is also commemorated by Australians right around the country (Reconciliation Australia).

Students participated in lessons and prayer activities as a way of informing and building their understanding of the past and their role in creating a unified future for all Australians. This week is National Reconciliation Week. The theme this year is, Be Brave, Make A Change. Students will be participating in learning activities that are integrated into their regular lessons including reading, writing and creative arts.

Industrial Action

Today most of our staff have participated in industrial action to progress their claims for a new enterprise agreement. Eligible staff are legally entitled to take protected industrial action. Whilst I know this was disruptive to some families I'm sure most would agree that school staff are entitled to participate in action to further their entitlements at work. Morning Drop Off

Kiss and drop expectations for morning drop off include,

- Cars form a single queue along Gardenia Grove.
- Cars should not impede the bus zone or resident driveways.
- Children should only exit the car when their car is at the front of the line.
- Cars should not be exiting the line and risking an accident.

These expectations are in place to keep everyone safe. Council Rangers have begun regular patrols of Gardenia Grove and Wheeler St as there has been an increase in reports to council regarding unsafe driving.

Kiss and Drop is a privilege that could be removed by council at any time. Please help us to keep every child safe by respecting our expectations and the road rules.

Kiss and drop is traditionally run by the Parent Group. We require parent helpers to help run this service on a regular basis. If you are able to help please contact the office.
